Roman Striped Corner-
to-Corner Scarf

BEGINNER KNIT

When the temperature drops nothing compares to snuggling up in a cosy shawl. Bold stripes drape elegantly around the body in this easy-to-knit, triangle shaped shawl. Wear it wrapped around your shoulders for extra warmth or drape loosely over your shoulders for a chic evening look. Knitters looking to make this project should know how to cast on knit, increase, decrease and cast off.

MEASUREMENTS

One Size

Length (approx) 250

Width 50

Yarn Required:

Ficio Organic Cotton (M)	100g balls	1
Ficio Organic Cotton (C1)	100g balls	3
Ficio Organic Cotton (C2)	100g balls	2
Ficio Organic Cotton (C3)	100g balls	2

Please use only the yarn specified. Another yarn is likely to yield different results. Quantities are approximate as knitting styles may vary between knitters. Check the ball bands to ensure all yarn is from the same dye lot.

DIFFICULTY ●●●

KNITTING NEEDLES & EQUIPMENT:

A 4.00mm pair of needles.

A 4.00mm circular needle, 120cm or longer.

Wool needle for sewing in ends.

TENSION:

22 sts and 34rows to 10cm over garter stitch, using 4.00mm needles.

KNITTING ABBREVIATIONS:

K: Knit

Kfb: K1 into the fr of the next stitch on the needle but do not slide the stitch off, K1 into the bk of the same stitch on the needle and slide the stitch off the needle

SCARF

Set Up:

Using 4mm needles and MC cast on 2 sts.

Row 1 (RS): K1, Kfb ... 3 sts.

Row 2: K1, Kfb, K1 ... 4 sts.

Row 3: K1, Kfb, K2 ... 5 sts

Row 4: K3, Kfb, K1 ... 6 sts

Main Pattern:

Row 5: K1, Kfb, knit to last 3 sts, K2tog, K1

Row 6: Knit to last 2 sts, Kfb, K1

These two rows set increase pattern for the scarf. Continue to work this pattern until there are 204 sts AT THE SAME TIME working the stripe sequence below and changing colours as necessary

Row 31 - 40: Using Contrast Colour 1

Row 41 - 48: Using Main Colour

Row 67 - 86: Using Contrast Colour 1

Row 87 - 102: Using Main Colour

Row 103 - 118: Using Contrast Colour 1

Row 119 - 132: Using Main Colour

Row 133 - 142: Using Contrast Colour 2
