# Esther Beginner's Scarf BEGINNER KNIT

We know how daunting it can be finding your first project so we've made this classic, one ball scarf in our hardwearing Esther 8ply. With a stocking stitch centre, it's sure to drape well but also won't curl, due to the garter stitch border.

### **MEASUREMENTS**

Size		One Size
Width	cm	18.5
Length (without fringe)	cm	180
Yarn Required: Esther 8ply	200g balls	1

Please use only the yarn specified. Another yarn is likely to yield different results. Quantities are approximate as knitting styles may vary between knitters. Check the ball bands to ensure all yarn is from the same dye lot.

# ITEM A: Stitch Detail



### **DIFFICULTY**

### **KNITTING NEEDLES & EQUIPMENT:**

A pair of 4.00mm knitting needles.

OPTIONAL: 4.50mm crochet hook for fringing.

Wool needle for sewing in ends.

### **TENSION:**

22 sts and 28 rows to 10cm over stocking st, using 4.00mm needles.

### **KNITTING ABBREVIATIONS:**

K: KnitP: PurlWS: Wrong side

garter st: garter stitch, working every row in knit

# SCARF

# **Casting On:**

With 4.00mm needles and M, cast on 42 sts.

Work 8 row in garter st, knitting every row.

**Row 9 (RS):** Knit all sts **Row 10:** K6, P30, K6.

Repeat Rows 9 and 10 until piece measures 178cm from the beginning, ending with a WS row.

Work 8 rows in garter st and bind off knitwise.

### **FINISHING**

Weave in all ends.

# **Optional Fringing:**

Cut yarn into 90 x 30cm lengths. With 5 strands held together, fold in half to form a loop. Ins crochet hook into the cornner of one short edge of the scare and place the loop on the hook. Draw the loop through and push the ends through the loop and pull to tighten. Repeat for 9 fringed loops across each short end of the scarf.

Trim the fringe to make even.
