Square Scarf & Blanket

EASY KNIT



These squares are an easy knit project, so that everyone can participate in this enjoyable activity. The squares are knitted with 2 strands of yarn so the colours can be mixed. The squares are then sewn together to become a scarf or a blanket. Join 6 squares for a scarf, and 49 squares into a blanket.

MEASUREMENTS

	Width	Length
Each Square	22cm	22cm
Scarf	22cm	132cm
Blanket	154cm	154cm

YARN REQUIRED

Makr DK 100g balls

Scarf	6
Blanket	20

NOTE: This pattern is written in British English. All measurements in charts and instructions are in cm. For conversion from centimetres to inches please divide by 2.5cm. Please be aware that there are different terms for crocheting and knitting in American and British English, if in doubt, we've included a list of common abbreviations.

Please use only the yarn specified. Another yarn is likely to yield different results. Quantities are approximate as knitting styles may vary between knitters. Check the ball bands to ensure all yarn is from the same dye lot.

DIFFICULTY ●●●

NEEDLES AND EQUIPMENT:

A pair of 8 mm knitting needles, 30cm length
Wool needle for sewing squares and ends

TENSION:

13 stitches x 10 rows with 8mm needles and 2 strands of DK yarn on plain knit (garter) st = 10cm x 10cm

KNITTING ABBREVIATIONS:

K knit
St(s) stitch(es)

SQUARES.

Using cable cast-on method, cast on 24 sts with 8mm needles.

Work plain k garter stitch for 38 rows, or until square measures 22cm x 22cm.

Leave 30cm thread at start and finish to sew up squares later.

FINISHING

SCARF

Line up 6 squares vertically, and sew the edges together. Sew in ends to neaten.

BLANKET

Line up 7 squares horizontally, and sew the edges together. Repeat until you have 7 rows of 7 squares. Sew the vertical edges together so there are 49 squares in total. Sew in ends to neaten.
