Crystal Bolero

EASY KNIT

This Bolero is made with 2 rectangle lengths (like 2 scarfs), knitted in a rib stitch. They are joined together along the (scarf)lengths, where space is left for armholes. The cast-off edges are seamed together, and the cast-on edges are seamed to each other; which creates a contoured and sculptural look to the garment as they fall to the front. The Bolero is one size fits all; leaning to generously sized.

## MEASUREMENTS

ONE SIZE	
Chest Width	65-70cm
Body Length (Front)	60-70cm

## YARN REQUIRED

Makr CRYSTAL Yarn 250g balls

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NOTE: This pattern is written in British English. All measurements in charts and instructions are in cm. For conversion from centimetres to inches please divide by 2.5cm. Please be aware that there are different terms for crocheting and knitting in American and British English, if in doubt, we've included a list of common abbreviations.

Please use only the yarn specified. Another yarn is likely to yield different results. Quantities are approximate as knitting styles may vary between knitters. Check the ball bands to ensure all yarn is from the same dye lot.

DIFFICULTY ●●●

## NEEDLES AND EQUIPMENT:

A pair of 8 mm knitting needles, 35cm length  
Wool needle for sewing in ends

## TENSION:

18 stitches x 13 rows K1/P1 Rib with 8mm needles = 10cm x 10cm

## KNITTING ABBREVIATIONS:

K knit  
P purl  
St(s) stitch(es)

## BOLERO

BODY PIECES - Make 2.

Rib Stitch Cast on 46 sts with 8mm needles; \*starting with needle in the front of st, then next cast on stitch place needle in the back of st to cast on\*, repeating this alternation \* to \*. This is so the cast on will emulate a k1/p1 rib st.

Row 1 – 150:

Work K1/P1 RIB,

Cast off in rib (k1/p1) stitch.

## FINISHING

Darn 2 rectangle body pieces together, starting by joining cast-on edges together.

Placing the 2 rectangles, one on top of the other, count 40 rows of each rectangle which forms the first armhole.

Starting at the end of the 40 rows, darn 70 sts of the two rectangles together which forms the back of the garment.

Skip 40 rows which forms the other armhole.

Join cast-off edges together.
