Single Bed Quilt Cover #698

**150cm wide fabric – 4.5m  
(2.25m in pirate print and 2.25m in check)**

**Matching thread**

**5 buttons**

**Sewing machine with buttonhole facility**

**Tape measure**

**Scissors & pins**

**Measurements:**

140cm x 210cm

Cut two pieces of fabric 145cm x 225cm (one in pirate fabric for front, one in check fabric for back). With the right sides facing each other, pin the top and side edges and stitch using a 1.5cm seam allowance. Overlock seams if desired.

**The bottom edge:**

Fold the bottom edge over 5cm and press, fold it over again another 5cm, press, pin and sew. Evenly mark positions for the 5 buttons and make the button holes running across ways on the front piece of the quilt, sew the buttons to the inside of the back. (if you prefer quilt fasteners, press studs or velcro can be used instead of buttons).

To make larger sized quilt covers you will need to use sheeting fabric that is 240cm wide and join fabric.

**The sizes are:**

**King single** – 160cm x 210cm – cut two pieces 165cm x 225cm

**Double bed** – 180cm x 210cm – cut two pieces 185cm x 225cm

**Queen bed (Aust)** – 210cm x 210cm – cut two pieces 215cm x 225cm

**King size (Aust)** – 245cm 210cm cut two pieces 150cm x 225cm
