LIFE IN COX'S BAZAR CAN BE QUITE DARK...

According to a recent assessment* conducted by UNICEF and the Child Protection Sub-Sector, 59% of people living in Cox's Bazar believe that child protection concerns have increased over the last 12 months.



3 out of 5 community members believe child protection concerns have risen in the past year.

ChildFund has been alongside Rohingya refugees since the beginning, relieving suffering and building protective environments for children and youth.

However, COVID-19 restrictions have increased violence against women and children, including forced labour, early marriage, denial of resources and a lack of quality education.

Girls are particularly vulnerable in refugee camps, like Cox's Bazar, especially when going to the bathroom at night.

The gift of hygiene kits and solar-powered lanterns will offer another level of protection for girls.

7,440 CHILDREN AND YOUTH IN COX'S BAZAR TO BE SUPPORTED BY CHILDFUND AND MFAT.

Starting in January 2022, ChildFund and MFAT will partner to provide humanitarian assistance to 7,440 children, youth and family members through Child Protection and Disaster Risk Reduction activities. This will include distribution of 800 hygiene kits, 100 assistive devices for children with disabilities and 1,000 portable solar lamps to meet urgent needs of children who are in urgent need. 3,000 trees will be planted to support reforestation efforts.

200 children and youth will also receive psychosocial support and work to address issues related to child labour, early and forced marriage, child trafficking and sexual and gender-based violence.

When Rojina recalls what happened in Myanmar, her eyes fill with tears. "The militants killed 30 or 35 people in a hole near my home," she told ChildFund project staff... "they came back day after day."

"As soon as I arrived at the camp, I wasn't receiving any education and couldn't even play with other children. [When ChildFund opened a school in my block] I was so excited to join classes again."
