Hundreds of women have been given a hand up rather than a handout as they have become self-reliant through micro-enterprise mentoring and artisan jewelry training.

Over the years, Pearls with Purpose has aligned with other like-minded organizations such as Mentors International, Operation Underground Railroad, DoTerra

Healing Hands and Believe International. These partnerships have created opportunities to train and teach even more women while providing them with micro-loans and a product pipeline to truly grow their businesses. In addition, invaluable mentorship has been provided.

Every purchase gives our jewelry artisans greater independence and purpose. Which enables them to provide food and education for their families.




ARTISAN STORIES

After 8 years in the sex trade, Angelica has been living at the aftercare facility called Mercy Workshop since 2017. A mom of three, she is ferociously fighting for her 15-year-old daughter who has recently fallen into sex trafficking, recently giving birth to her unexpected granddaughter.



Alejandra

Alejandra is single mother with three children, ages 4, 7, and 11. She learned the art of making paper rolled beads about 5 years ago. She was making this type of beaded jewelry to sell hoping to provide a better life for her children, but, living in such a poor community, her income was never enough.



Niurca

Niurca was first rescued from Human
Trafficking 8 years ago. She lived at the Leche
Y Miel aftercare facility for a month and then
went back to prostitution and drugs. Today
she is back living at Leche Y Miel and she is
learning a new skill. She has only been back in
the program for about 8 months

Erika is only 17 years old, but in her short life she has experienced many hardships. She was sold at the age of 12 into human trafficking. It was only the day before we arrived at the aftercare facility of Leche Y Miel that she had been rescued.

Veniela was rescued 4 years ago from Human Trafficking and is now one of the "House Moms". She has a heart of gold and, having been in the shoes of those rescued, she is also very patient and caring. She is a natural leader in a strong and loving way. She has become our co-op leader at Leche Y Miel and manages the organization of supplies, materials, and workmanship when orders are received.

Liss

When we first met Liss she had only been living in the aftercare facility for about three months. She is 21 and the mother of 3 children under the age of 3, all from different fathers. She was first trafficked at the age of 15. Because of the horrible circumstances associated with sex trafficking, it resulted in several pregnancies.



Kalaiselvi

Eight years ago Kalaiselvi was pregnant with her second child and wanted to help support her family. Kalaiselvi and her husband Boopathy have a love marriage, which is unique in India where typically marriages are arranged. Kalaizelvi was able to learn jewelry making from Pearls With Purpose. She is very dedicated to supporting her co-op and only one year after starting she was voted by her group to become the co-manager with Jayalakshmi.



LeLani Adalla

LeLani understands poverty. She was born and raised in a squatters village with eight other siblings located five hours outside of Manila. Lani was given her first toothbrush at the age of 18. She knows first-hand the cycle of poverty- and the ability of an individual when offered hope, education and mentoring to break that cycle.
