## SETTING THE TRAP



- To set the trap, simply lift the two locking rings together and open the door
- Lift the trip rod upwards so it engages with the rod on the door. This will lift the trip plate and keep the door open until an animal enters the trap and stands on the trip plate.
- Once the trap is activated, the door will immediately close, trapping the animal.
- The locking rings prevent the animal from escaping from the trap.



## **PROTRAP**

- Place the trap in an area
  where you have seen the
  target animal. Most animals
  have specific areas or runs,
  they use to get from place to
  place
- For Trap shy animals, the trap can be camouflaged in bush or grass. In residential areas animals will often move along a fence or similar boundary, which can be a good place to position the trap.



## TRAP POSITION

- It is normally easiest to place bait in the trap, before the trap is set.
- Place bait past the trip plate, at the far end of the trap or tie bait up at the top back of the trap.
- The bait door at the rear of the trap allows easy access to place bait. Pull out the locking pin to the open the bait door, then replace the pin to lock the door in place, once the trap is baited.
- For some birds and some animals, often it is a good idea to place small pieces of bait leading into the trap, so they find their way into the trap.
