SECTION 2. HAZARD IDENTIFICATION

Danger

Extremely flammable aerosol.

IF IN EYES: Rinse cautiously with water for several minutes. Remove contact lenses, if present and easy to do.

Continue rinsing.

If eye irritation persists: Get medical advice/attention. Call a POISON CENTRE or doctor if you feel unwell.

Store in a well-ventilated place.

Store locked up.

Protect from sunlight. Do not expose to temperatures exceeding 50 °C/122 °F.

Dispose of contents and container in accordance with local, regional, national and international regulations.

SECTION 4. FIRST-AID MEASURES

First-aid Measures

Inhalation

Remove person to fresh air and keep comfortable for breathing. Get medical advice or attention if you feel unwell or are concerned.

Skin Contact

Take off immediately contaminated clothing, shoes and leather goods (e.g. watchbands, belts). Wash gently and thoroughly with lukewarm, gently flowing water and mild soap for 5 minutes. If skin irritation occurs, get medical advice or attention.

Eye Contact

Immediately rinse the contaminated eye(s) with lukewarm, gently flowing water for 15-20 minutes, while holding the eyelid(s) open. Take care not to rinse contaminated water into the unaffected eye or onto the face. Immediately call a Poison Centre or doctor.

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Ingestion

Never give anything by mouth if person is rapidly losing consciousness, or is unconscious or convulsing. Do not induce vomiting. If vomiting occurs naturally, lie on your side in the recovery position. Rinse mouth with water again. Slowly dilute with 1-2 glasses of water or milk, seek medical attention.

Extinguishing Media

Carbon dioxide, dry chemical powder or appropriate foam.

Unsuitable Extinguishing Media

Do not use a direct stream of water.

Specific Hazards Arising from the Product

Highly flammable liquid and vapour. Can ignite at room temperature. Releases vapour that can form explosive mixture with air. sprayed product will project a flame on contact with an ignition source. containers may explode if heated.

Vapours are heavier than air. May travel a considerable distance to a source of ignition and flash back to a leak or open container.

Carbon oxides, and other unidentified organic compounds.

Special Protective Equipment and Precautions for Fire-fighters

Use extreme caution, fight fire from a safe distance or a protected location.

SECTION 6. ACCIDENTAL RELEASE MEASURES

Personal Precautions, Protective Equipment, and Emergency Procedures

Use the personal protective equipment recommended in Section 8 of this safety data sheet. Eliminate all ignition sources. Use grounded, explosion-proof equipment.

Environmental Precautions

Do not allow into any sewer, on the ground or into any waterway. If the spill is inside a building, prevent product from entering drains, ventilation systems and confined areas.

Methods and Materials for Containment and Cleaning Up

Contain and soak up spill with absorbent that does not react with spilled product. Place used absorbent into suitable, covered, labelled containers for disposal. Contaminated absorbent poses the same hazard as the spilled product.

SECTION 7. HANDLING AND STORAGE

Precautions for Safe Handling

Eliminate heat and ignition sources such as sparks, open flames, hot surfaces and static discharge. Post "No Smoking" signs. Wash hands thoroughly after handling this material. Avoid repeated or prolonged skin contact with product or with contaminated equipment/surfaces. Do not get in eyes, on skin or on clothing.

Conditions for Safe Storage

Store in a closed container. Empty containers may contain hazardous residue. Store separately. Keep closed. Follow all precautions given on this safety data sheet. Protect from sunlight. Store in an area that is: well-ventilated, cool, dry. Store in an area that is: out of direct sunlight and away from heat and ignition sources.

Appropriate Engineering Controls

Sufficient mechanical ventilation to maintain exposures below the TLV. Under normal conditions of use, general ventilation should be satisfactory.
