Dear Friends:

In the four months since I became President and CEO of Ronald McDonald House New York, I have been struck by the profound sense of purpose that drives our organization. We keep families close at the most vulnerable time in their lives. To get to the core of what we do and who we are, I have met individually with each of our employees, many of our families, Board members, and some of our hospital partners. It has been both gratifying and humbling to become fully conscious of the crucial role RMH-NY plays in an elaborate ecosystem of pediatric cancer care.

Families come from all over the world to stay with us while their child undergoes treatment. This is the world's House. I spoke with a young girl from Croatia who, when she first got to the House, spoke little English and was very shy. She has blossomed in her time here and is now so engaging, dynamic, and outspoken. I met a boy from Saint Vincent who was outgoing and upbeat when he told me that though he had been in-patient for two weeks, he was feeling okay and was just happy to be back at the House. I watched as these two children became fast friends and played in the Playroom together.

Our multicultural diversity is one of our greatest assets and we are working to ensure that we support the values, beliefs, and behaviors that families of many cultures bring to the House.

Year-round, the programs and services we provide help children and caregivers forget about long days at the hospital and spend time as a family. None of what we do would be possible without your support. Over the holidays, this support allowed our families to come together and celebrate the season, even as they were so far from home. It is because of you that, even in the most trying of times, these families are able to make happy memories. Following the holidays, however, we also felt sadness in the passing of Frank Pellegrino, member of our Board of Directors and friend of many years. Our heart goes out to his family, just as his heart always went out to us.

I believe compassion is not simply a noun. It is an action. We are proud to open our first Family Room at New York Health + Hospitals / Kings County, the largest public hospital in New York City with some of the most vulnerable families in the county. Our House expansion project, slated for completion by Labor Day, will allow us to accommodate and help more families than



We are hard at work preparing for our expanded scope and scale. Strategic planning in concert with our Board of Directors, staff, and hospital partners is currently underway. Our staff and volunteers are participating in ongoing training in the fields of pediatric cancers and advances in cancer treatment. In the rapidly changing world of pediatric disease, we will be ready to meet the needs of our population. Our focus at Ronald McDonald House New York remains clear. Everything we do is for the benefit of the families we serve. It is truly my honor to be part of that venerable mission with you.

For the Suero family, the road to Ronald McDonald House New York has not been easy. However, when watching the family of five interact with one another, as they constantly smile and laugh together, it is impossible to tell the struggle they have faced since Luis' leukemia diagnosis.

As they shift back and forth between English and their native language, Spanish, the Suero's appear overwhelmingly grateful to be in each other's presence. Luis, now 17 years old, has been living at RMH-NY with his mother, Ilsa, for over a year and a half. His two older sisters, Silvia and Ilsa, and his father, Silvio, are currently visiting from their home in Dominican Republic, and it is clear that they are overjoyed to be reunited as a whole family.



It was only a few years ago that Luis, while travelling in the US, found himself feeling sick. After a month of tests here in New York, Luis, at age 15, received his diagnosis: leukemia. Following his diagnosis, Luis spent two and half months in the hospital with his mother by his side. When he finally got out in May 2015, he and his mother settled at their new home, Ronald McDonald House New York.

When looking back on those first few months, Silvio, Luis' father, describes how difficult it was for the family to cope with the diagnosis as well as the decision for Luis and Ilsa to stay in New York. When Silvio first learned about RMH-NY, he immediately turned to the Internet to research the organization and very quickly decided that it was the best place for Luis. He explains, "It's a blessing to have Luis and Ilsa stay at Ronald McDonald House together. Ronald McDonald House makes the stay here easier. I am not saying that just to say it. It is simply the truth."







Silvio emphasizes the importance of having the family together as much as possible. He says that Luis feels better when they are all close by, as he views Luis' treatment as twofold: "There is the medicine and then there is the love and strength that comes from our family being by his side. The two work in tandem."

As the family reminisces on the past couple years, they elaborate on how returning to RMH-NY at the end of the day has given Luis a distraction from what he faces at the hospital. Coming home to the House is comfortable for Luis and allows him to play and be a normal teenager.

While Luis has countless favorite memories, he particularly enjoys playing games with the staff and volunteers, taking trips to the theater to see a movie, and meeting celebrities when they come to visit. One of the family's most treasured memories was when Luis was chosen to have Broadway composers and performers create an original song about him through the 'Songs in the Key of Me' event hosted by the House and Broadway Inspirational Voices.

While the Suero family lights up as they talk about these joyous experiences, Silvio attributes the family's constant positivity to Luis: "He is our hero. He has taught us a lot. He believes this is temporary and that he will be able to go back home soon."

"There is the medicine and then there is the love and strength that comes from our family being by his side. The two work in tandem." Until he and Ilsa can return to Dominican Republic, the Suero's cherish the few times a year when the family can be together. Silvio describes this valuable time, saying, "Without family, it is almost impossible to get better. That is where Ronald McDonald House comes in. It makes everything easier for the whole family, not just the patient. It is the best thing that could have happened to us."
