Build trust, belonging, and personal growth.

Gain sensitivity to micro-aggressions and ways to avoid them, as well as how to avoid slipping into defensiveness, deflection... or worse, deflecting tears and useless shame.

Explore more appropriate ways of showing appreciation, inviting curiosity and creating mutuality.

"MICRO-AGGRESSION MOVIE"

Long ago, I used to answer questions like "why is it not OK to say Obama is 'articulate'?" How 2010s that was!

Today, participants engage in their own awareness-building and blind-spot correcting. Based on the **Ten Cardinal Sins of Failed Allyship**, we will explore two dozen+ phrases, often expressed by inquisitive, progressively minded wanna-be allies, that are usually met with disdain, dismissal, or worse.
