

PRODUCT SAFETY

PRECAUTIONS TO AVOID POSSIBLE EXPOSURE TO EXCESSIVE MICROWAVE ENERGY

- (a). Do not attempt to operate this oven with the door open since this can result in harmful exposure to microwave energy. It is important not to break or tamper with the safety interlocks.
- (b). Do not place any object between the oven front face and the door or allow soil or cleaner residue to accumulate on sealing surfaces.



(c). **WARNING**: If the door or door seals are damaged, the oven must not be operated until it has been repaired by a competent person.

ADDENDUM ·

If the apparatus is not maintained in a good state of cleanliness, its surface could be degraded and affect the lifespan of the apparatus and lead to a dangerous situation.

This appliance is not intended for use by persons (including children) with reduced physical, sensory or mental capabilities, or lack of experience and knowledge, unless they have been given supervision or instruction concerning use of the appliance by a person responsible for their safety.

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Children should be supervised to ensure that they do not play with the appliance.

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If the supply cord is damaged, it must be replaced by the manufacturer, its service agent or similarly qualified persons in order to avoid a hazard.

WARNING: Ensure that the appliance is switched off before replacing the lamp to avoid the possibility of electric shock.

warning: It is hazardous for anyone other than a competent person to carry out any service or repair operation that involves the removal of a cover which gives protection against exposure to microwave energy.

warning: Liquids and other foods must not be heated in sealed containers since they are liable to explode.

When heating food in plastic or paper containers, keep an eye on the oven due to the possibility of ignition.



Only use utensils that are suitable for use in microwave ovens.

If smoke is emitted, switch off or unplug the appliance and keep the door closed in order to stifle any flames.


Microwave heating of beverages can result in delayed eruptive boiling, therefore care must be taken when handling the container.

The contents of feeding bottles and baby food jars shall be stirred or shaken and the temperature checked before consumption, in order to avoid burns.

The oven should be cleaned regularly and any food deposits removed.

Please keep the waveguide area clean. Use soft damp cloth to clean it up when

there is food splash residue on the waveguide area or the cavity. Failure to clean food residue may cause innocuous sparking or some smoke in the microwave cavity, discoloration of the cavity may also occur.



Failure to maintain the oven in a clean condition could lead to deterioration of the surface that could adversely affect the life of the appliance and possibly result in a hazardous situation.

Only use the temperature probe recommended for this oven. (for ovens provided with a facility to use a temperature-sensing probe.)

The microwave oven must be operated with the decorative door open. (for ovens with a decorative door.)

This appliance is intended to be used in household and similar applications such as:

- staff kitchen areas in shops, offices and other working environments;
- by clients in hotels, motels and other residential type environments;
- 3. farm houses;
- 4. bed and breakfast type environments.

The microwave oven is intended for heating food and beverages. Drying of food or clothing and heating of warming pads, slippers, sponges, damp cloth and similar may lead to risk of injury, ignition or fire.



The appliance is intended to be used freestanding.

 \triangle

The rear surface of appliances shall be placed against a wall.

Eggs in their shell and whole hard-boiled eggs should not be heated in microwave ovens since they may explode, even after microwave heating has ended.



The appliance must not be installed behind a decorative door in order to avoid overheating.

(This is not applicable for appliances with decorative door.)

The microwave oven shall not be placed in a cabinet unless it has been tested in a cabinet.

Metallic containers for food and beverages are not allowed during microwave cooking.

The appliance shall not be cleaned with a steam cleaner.

The appliances are not intended to be operated by means of an external timer or separate remote-control system.

READ CAREFULLY AND KEEP FOR FUTURE REFERENCE

TO REDUCE THE RISK OF INJURY TO PERSONS GROUNDING INSTALLATION

This appliance must be grounded. In the event of an electrical short circuit, grounding reduces the risk of electric shock by providing an escape wire for the electric current.

This appliance is equipped with a cord having a grounding wire

This appliance is equipped with a cord having a grounding wire with a grounding plug. The plug must be plugged into an outlet that is properly installed and grounded.

WARNING - Improper use of the grounding can result in a risk of electric shock. Consult a qualified electrician or serviceman if the grounding instructions are not completely understood or if doubt exists as to whether the appliance is properly grounded. If it is necessary to use an extension cord, use only a 3-wire extension cord.



Electric Shock Hazard:

Touching some of the internal components can cause serious personal injury or death. Do not disassemble this appliance.

TO REDUCE THE RISK OF INJURY TO PERSONS GROUNDING INSTALLATION

Electric Shock Hazard:

Improper use of the grounding can result in electric shock. Do not plug into an outlet until appliance is properly installed and grounded.

- 1. A short power-supply cord is provided to reduce the risks resulting from becoming entangled in or tripping over a longer cord.
- 2. If a long cord or extension cord is used:
 - (1). The marked electrical rating of the cord set or extension cord should be at least as great as the electrical rating of the appliance.
 - (2). The extension cord must be a grounding-type 3-wire cord.
 - (3). The longer cord should be arranged so that it will not drape over the counter top or tabletop where it can be pulled on by children or tripped over unintentionally.



CLEANING

Be sure to unplug the appliance from the power supply.

- 1. Clean the cavity of the oven after using with a slightly damp cloth.
- 2. Clean the accessories in the usual way in soapy water.
- 3. The door frame and seal and neighbouring parts must be cleaned carefully with a damp cloth when they are dirty.
- 4. Do not use harsh abrasive cleaners or sharp metal scrapers to clean the oven door glass since they can scratch the surface, which may result in shattering of the glass.
- 5. Cleaning Tip---For easier cleaning of the cavity walls that the food cooked can touch: Place half a lemon in a bowl, add 300ml (1/2 pint) water and heat on 100% microwave power for 10 minutes. Wipe the oven clean using a soft, dry cloth.


Personal Injury Hazard:

There may be certain non-metallic utensils that are not safe to use for microwaving. If in doubt, you can test the utensil in question following the procedure below.

Utensil Test:

- 1. Fill a microwave-safe container with 1 cup of cold water (250ml) along with the utensil in question.
- 2. Cook on maximum power for 1 min.
- 3. Carefully feel the utensil. If the empty utensil is warm, do not use it for microwave cooking.
- 4. Do not exceed 1 min cooking time.





KEEP THE CAVITY AND WAVEGUIDE AREA CLEAN

Browning dish	Follow manufacturer's instructions. The bottom of browning dish must be at least 3/16 inch (5mm) above the turntable. Incorrect usage may cause the turntable to break.	\bigcirc
Dinnerware	Microwave-safe only. Follow manufacturer's instructions. Do not use cracked or chipped dishes.	\bigcirc
Glass jars	Always remove lid. Use only to heat food until just warm. Most glass jars are not heat resistant and may break.	\bigcirc
Glassware	Heat-resistant oven glassware only. Make sure there is no metallic trim. Do not use cracked or chipped dishes.	\bigcirc
Oven cooking bags	Follow manufacturer's instructions. Do not close with metal tie. Make slits to allow steam to escape.	\bigcirc
Paper plates and cups	Use for short–term cooking/warming only. Do not leave oven unattended while cooking.	\bigcirc
Paper towels	Use to cover food for reheating and absorbing fat. Use with supervision for a short-term cooking only.	\bigcirc
Parchment paper	Use as a cover to prevent splattering or a wrap for steaming.	\bigcirc

Microwave-safe only. Follow the manufacturer's instructions. Should be labeled "Microwave Safe". Some plastic containers soften, as the food inside gets hot. "Boiling bags" and tightly closed plastic bags should be slit, pierced or vented as directed by package.





Microwave-safe only. Use to cover food during cooking to retain moisture. Do not allow plastic wrap to touch food.





Microwave-safe only (meat and candy thermometers).





Use as a cover to prevent splattering and retain moisture.

Metal twist ties	May cause arcing and could cause a fire in the oven.	\otimes

Plastic foam	Plastic foam may melt or contaminate the liquid inside when exposed to high temperature.	\otimes
Wood	Wood will dry out when used in the microwave oven and may split or crack.	\otimes



SETTING UP YOUR OVEN

TURNTABLE INSTALLATION

Cleaning the cooking compartment and putting the turntable in place.


For new installations, make sure all packaging and shipping tape has been removed from the turntable shaft.


Before using the appliance to prepare food for the first time, you will need to put the turntable in place correctly. You must clean the cooking compartment and accessories.


How to put the turntable in place:


- 1. Place the turntable ring assembly (3) into the recess in the cooking compartment.
- 2. Place the glass turntable ①on the turntable ring assembly ③. Fit the raised, curved lines in the center of the glass turntable bottom between the three spokes of the shaft.

Make sure that the glass turntable 1 engages in the turntable shaft 2 in the center of the cooking compartment floor. The rollers on the shaft should fit inside the turntable bottom ridge.











- Both glass turntable and turntable ring assembly must always be used during cooking.
- All food and containers of food are always placed on the glass turntable for cooking.
- Never restrict the movement of the turntable.
- If glass turntable or turntable ring assembly cracks or breaks, contact your nearest authorized service center.

SETTING UP YOUR OVEN


COUNTERTOP INSTALLATION

Remove all packing material and accessories. Examine the oven for any damage such as dents or broken door. Do not install if oven is damaged.

Cabinet: Remove any protective film found on the microwave oven cabinet surface. Do not remove the waveguide cover that is attached to the oven cavity to protect the magnetron.

INSTALLATION

- 1. Select a level surface that provide enough open space for the intake and/or outlet vents.
 - a. The minimum installation height is 85cm.
 - b. The rear surface of appliance shall be placed against a wall. Leave a minimum clearance of 30cm above the oven. A minimum clearance of 20cm is required between the oven and any adjacent walls but behind is not consider.
 - c. Do not remove the legs from the bottom of the oven.
 - d. Blocking the intake and/or outlet openings can damage the oven.
 - e. Place the oven as far away from radios and TV as possible.
 Operation of microwave oven may cause interference to your radio or TV reception.

2. Plug your oven into a standard household outlet. Be sure the voltage and the frequency is the same as the voltage and the frequency on the rating label.



 Do not install oven over a range cooktop or other heat-producing appliance.
 If installed near or over a heat source, the oven could be damaged and the warranty would be voided.





The accessible surface may be hot during operation.

INSTRUCTION FOR USE

BEFORE USING FOR THE FIRST TIME

It is normal that the oven may produce unpleasant odors when it is used for the first time.

This section tells you what you need to do before using your microwave to prepare food for the first time. Read the section entitled "**PRODUCT SAFETY**" beforehand.


Before you can use your new appliance, you will need to put the turntable in place correctly. You must also clean the cooking compartment and accessories.



- Never use the appliance without the turntable.
- Make sure that it is properly engaged. The turntable can turn clockwise or anti-clockwise.

1. POWER LEVELS -

Five power levels are available.

2. CLOCK SETTING

When the microwave oven is plugged into an outlet, "0:00" will display.

a Press Timer/Clock twice, 00:00 will flash.

b Press number keys to set the time, it should be within 00:00~23:59. For example, press 1,2,0,5 to set the time to "12:05".

• In the process of setting clock, if the Timer/Clock pad is not pressed or if there is no operation within 1 minute, the display will automatically return to the previous state.

Press number keys to set the timer, it should be within 00:00~99:99. For example, press 5,0,0 to set the timer to 5 minutes.

a In waiting or clock state, press Melt once, A-02 will display.

- Chop the chocolate before melting it, and stiring it during melting.
- Cut the melt butter into small pieces before melting it, and cover it with plastic wrap to prevent frying.

a In waiting or clock state, press Reheat repeatedly, reheat menu "h-01,h-02" will display in order.

10. MEMORY FUNCTION-

Press Memory to program and choose up to three cooking procedures. Each procedure will be indicated by 1, 2 or 3 in the display.

12. LOCK FUNCTION -

To lock the microwave so that it cannot be operated by children or other unintended users.

To lock,in waiting or clock state, press STOP/clear for 3 seconds, the buzzer will sound twice, [displays.

13. AUTO MENU -

a Press Auto Menu once to enter menu function. A-01 will display.

CLEANING AND MAINTENANCE

CLEANING

With good care and cleaning, your appliance will retain its appearance and remain fully functioning for a long time to come. We will explain below how you should correctly care for and clean your appliance.



- Scratched glass in the appliance door may develop into a crack.
 Do not use a glass scraper, sharp or abrasive cleaning aids or detergents.
- The surface of the appliance may become damaged if it is not cleaned properly. Microwave energy may escape.
 Clean the appliance on a regular basis, and remove any food remnants immediately.
- Do not immerse the appliance in water or clean under a jet of water.

Cleaning agent

To ensure that the different surfaces are not damaged by using the wrong cleaning agent, observe the information in the table. Wash new sponge cloths thoroughly before use.

Do not use:



Harsh or abrasive cleaning agents



Hard scouring pads or sponges



Metal or glass scrapers to clean the door panels



Cleaning agents with a high alcohol content



Metal or glass scrapers to clean the door seal

APPLIANCE FRONT

Hot soapy water:

Clean using a dish cloth and then dry with a soft cloth. Do not use metal or glass scrapers for cleaning.



APPLIANCE FRONT WITH STAINLESS STEEL

Hot soapy water:


Clean using a dish cloth and then dry with a soft cloth. Remove splashes and patches of limescale, grease, starch and albumin immediately. Corrosion can form under these patches or splashes. Do not use glass cleaners or metal or glass scrapers for cleaning.



COOKING COMPARTMENT MADE OF STAINLESS STEEL

Hot soapy water or vinegar solution:

Clean using a dish cloth and then dry with a soft cloth. Do not use oven spray or any other aggressive oven cleaners or abrasive materials. Scouring pads, rough sponges and pan cleaners are also unsuitable. These items scratch the surface. Allow the interior surfaces to dry completely.



RECESS IN THE COOKING COMPARTMENT

Damp cloth:

Water must not be allowed to run into the appliance through the turntable drive. Dry the turntable drive with a cloth.



TURNTABLE AND ROLLER RING

Hot soapy water:

When placing the turntable back into its recess, it must engage properly.



DOOR PANELS

Glass cleaner:

Clean with a dish cloth. Do not use glass scrapers.

TROUBLE SHOOTING

Check your problem by using the chart below and try the solutions for each problem. If the microwave oven still does not work properly, contact the nearest authorized service center.
