POLISHED PLASTER This is a durable option that can withstand even the messiest of chefs. Plaster is breathable, meaning it allows moisture to evaporate swiftly. We love the 'Urbo' kitchen (left, from £35,000, Roundhouse; roundhousedesign.com).

PAINT Choose a colour that complements your cabinetry. Katy Fontana, creative director of British Standard suggests using an oil-based eggshell paint, which can withstand scuffs (kitchen, right, from £7,000, British Standard; british standardcupboards.co.uk).
