Woodland birds

Unjumble the letters to name the woodland birds.

Can you spot each one in the surrounding trees?

Write the matching numbers in the circles next to the birds.

1. WATNY WOL

Reddish-brown bird of prey that nests in holes in trees. Makes a 'twit-two' call.

2. OOWD IPOEGN

Large grey bird with a white patch on its neck and bright yellow rings around its eyes.

3. LUEB TTI

Small with a bright blue head, wings and tail. From a family of birds called 'tits'.

4. TEER PRECEER

Creeps up trees, looking for grubs in the bark. Brown with a white tummy.

5. NOLG-DIALTE ITT

Small bird from the tit family, with pink markings and tail longer than its body. Lives in groups.

6. EERGN KWDOPOECRE

Large and green with a long, sharp beak to peck holes in trees while searching for food.
