Soy Confetti Candle

What You Need

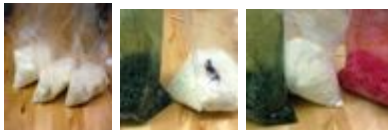
Container Soy Wax
Glass Jar, Container Caution Label
Soy Wick Sized to Jar Diameter, Stickum
Liquid Dyes – Assorted Colours
Fragrance Oil to Co-ordinate with Colours
Heat Source, Thermometer
Melting Pot
Skewers
Zip Lock Bags



How To Make It

Preparing Coloured Waxes

Divide Wax into separate ziplock bags, one per colour
Use 4 drops of liquid dye for ½ pound of wax, drop onto wax
Zip closed and shake
CAUTION - DYE STAINS! Don't get it on any surface you like; countertop, clothes – it doesn't come out
Leave one bag uncoloured



Prepare Glassware

Always place container caution label on bottom of jar when reselling or gifting.
Use soy wick sized to jar diameter. This jar is 3" diam, using a 3"-4" soy wick.
Use stickum to secure.



Layering Wax

Place coloured wax pellets in jar

If layers are desired. place one colour. If confetti pattern is desired, toss colours together

Do not fill jar to top with pellets, even if colours are tossed together



Heating and Pouring

Soy can be melted in the microwave or double boiler

Melt the plain wax and add scent at a ratio of 25ml per lb of wax

In this example, Christmas Garland fragrance oil was used

Once liquid, cover to just below the top of the green pellets if you do not want colours to blend, cover all of the green if you want the colours to variegate

If your wax is hot (150F), pellets will melt more, and you will see less “confetti” and more of a solid colour



Pouring Layers

Between the green and red layer, sprinkle some white pellets to create a buffer between colours

Layer the red pellets on top of white pellets

Pour liquid soy wax over the red pellets, just below top of the red or cover red based on desired outcome

Confetti candles will have to be done in the same manner, layering pellets, covering with melted wax, next layer, cover, etc.



Finishing

Here we have removed the ring from the lid, filled the lid with coloured pellets, covered opening with plastic, replaced the ring and trimmed.

Notice how much whiter the candle becomes once it cools
