Another Tomorrow Chemicals Policy

Another Tomorrow is dedicated to protecting people, eco-systems, and the planet. All life is made up of chemicals, we eat them, we breath them and they are an essential part any manufacturing process. However, some chemicals cause harm to people, animals, and the environment. It is those we strive to eliminate.

The health of our customer is critically important to us and we ensure all our products conform to international safety standards. Using a *PRSL*, *Product Restricted Substance List*, we keep harmful chemicals off our clothing. We likewise ensure the control of the use of chemicals at all stages of the manufacturing process. For Another Tomorrow, it is not acceptable to use many standard chemicals in processing and then wash them off to meet final product safety standards. This intermediate use can result in damage to the aquatic system and give rise to health issues to employees and communities in places of manufacture.

Therefore, just as Another Tomorrow tracks the origins of fibres and raw materials, we work with our supply chain to ensure chemicals are managed to ambitious levels at each stage of production.

We believe to successfully work towards the elimination of hazardous chemicals, no single brand can do this alone. A holistic approach is required engaging the wider chemical industry, material suppliers, industry peers and other stakeholders. Collaboration provides clearer guidelines and faster implementation. Therefore, we recognize the Zero Discharge of Hazardous Chemical Foundation (ZDHC) as a body that fulfills industry collaboration and have adopted the ZDHC MRSL (Manufacturing Restricted Substance List) 2.0 as the standard to measure chemical conformance during the manufacturing process.

Working with our supply chain, all our wet processors (Dyers, Finishers, Printers etc.) are instructed to abide by the ZDHC MRSL and together we monitor that the chemicals used in the manufacture of Another Tomorrow product do not exceed the limits detailed in that standard. We insist that all of our wet processors are transparent about chemicals held and used on site by sharing Chemical Inventory Lists (CILs) or ZDHC InCheck™ reports. For instance, this could include dyes, detergents, surfactants, chemical auxiliaries, cleaning solvents etc. No chemicals listed on the MRSL should be used intentionally within the Another Tomorrow supply chain.

In 2019, we visited the majority of our mills and wet processors, and surveyed the others, to ensure we only work with those who operate in a safe and responsible manner. We set the benchmark and groundwork towards continuous improvement in chemical management. Together, we will continue to use the tools of ZDHC and SAC (HIGG Index) to make a positive impact.

During 2020, we will continue to build a transparent relationship with suppliers and expand scope to include reporting Wastewater Quality.
