London's designs reflect a free–spirited, improvisational approach to yarn crafting.

London uses a slip knot and just 3 stitches in her designs – a chain stitch, a slip stitch and a single crochet stitch. Watch our how-to videos at LionBrand.com/londonkaye for how to make a slip knot and how to do each of the 3 stitches.

Remember that London's style is big loose stitches! Don't pull your yarn tightly or try for uniform, even stitches. Our diagrams show orderly stitches. Use the diagrams to plot your course, but we encourage you to go your own way and place your stitches as you like.

Our patterns are meant to inspire you to embrace your creative spirit!

HERE'S HOW

Step 1 With B, make a slip knot onto the hook and chain 3. Join the last chain to the first chain with a slip stitch to make a ring.

Terms

sc = single crochet

turn = turn your piece around so that the side that was facing you is now facing away from you.



Step 3 Chain 1, make 2 sc in each sc around, slip stitch in first sc to join –you'll have 12 sc.


Step 2 Chain 1, make 6 sc in the ring, then slip stitch in first sc to join – you'll have 6 sc.




Step 4 Chain 1, *make 1 sc in the next sc, make 2 sc in the next sc; repeat from * around, slip stitch in first sc to join – you'll have 18 sc.









Step 5 Chain 1, *make 2 sc in the next sc, make 1 sc in each of the next 2 sc; repeat from * around, slip stitch in first sc to join – you'll have 24 sc.



Step 6 Chain 1, make 1 sc in each of the next 2 sc, *make 2 sc in the next sc, make 1 sc in each of the next 3 sc; repeat from * 4 more times, make 2 sc in the next sc, make 1 sc in the next sc, slip stitch in first sc to join – you'll have 30 sc.



Step 7 Chain 1, *make 1 sc in each of the next 4 sc, make 2 sc in the next sc; repeat from * around, slip stitch in first sc to join – you'll have 36 sc.



Step 8 Chain 1, *make 2 sc in the next sc, make 1 sc in each of the next 5 sc; repeat from * around, slip stitch in first sc to join – you'll have 42 sc. Fasten off.

Continents

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We've diagrammed 3 continents. Make as many of each continent as you like!

Continent I



Step 1 With C, make a slip knot onto the hook and chain 5. Make 1 sc in the 2nd chain from hook, then make 1 sc in each of the next 3 chain – you'll have 4 sc.



Step 2 Chain 1, turn, skip the first sc, make 1 sc in each of the next 3 sc – you'll have 3 sc.



Step 3 Chain 1, turn, skip the first sc, make 1 sc in each of the next 2 sc you'll have 2 sc.



Step 4 Chain 1, turn, make 1 sc in each of the 2 sc.



Step 5 Chain 1, turn, skip the first sc, make 2 sc in the next sc, make sc stitches evenly spaced along the side edge of the continent, then slip stitch to join. Fasten off.



Continent II



Step 1 With C, make a slip knot onto the hook and chain 7. Make 1 sc in the 2nd chain from hook, make 1 sc in each of the next 4 chain, make 2 sc in the last chain– you'll have 7 sc.



Step 2 Chain 1, turn, make sc stitches evenly spaced around the outside edge of the continent, then slip stitch to join. Fasten off.

Continent III



Step 1 With C, make a slip knot onto the hook and chain 4. Make 1 sc in the 2nd chain from hook, make 1 sc in the next chain, make 3 sc in the last chain – you'll have 5 sc.



Step 2 Make 3 more sc along the bottom edge of the continent then slip stitch to join. Fasten off.

Glue yarn tails to the back of the pieces.

Glue the continents to the Planet. London overlapped two of the continents to make a bigger continent.
