## LARGE PEACE SIGN

### SIZE

About 30 in. (76 cm)

### MATERIALS

- LION BRAND® - LONDON KAYE®  
THEME PACK (Art. #3001)  
#614 Peace Out Pack
- LION BRAND® - LONDON KAYE®  
HOOK WITH A TWIST™ (Art. #3002)  
#303 Large (20 mm) crochet hook

### YOU'LL ALSO NEED

Hot glue and glue gun

### Wrap it! Glue it! Tie it!

London's designs reflect a free-spirited, improvisational approach to yarn crafting.

London uses a slip knot and just 3 stitches in her designs – a chain stitch, a slip stitch and a single crochet stitch. Watch our how-to videos at [LionBrand.com/londonkaye](http://LionBrand.com/londonkaye) for how to make a slip knot and how to do each of the 3 stitches.

Remember that London's style is big loose stitches! Don't pull your yarn tightly or try for uniform, even stitches. Our diagrams show orderly stitches. Use the diagrams to plot your course, but we encourage you to go your own way and place your stitches as you like.

Our patterns are meant to inspire you to embrace your creative spirit!

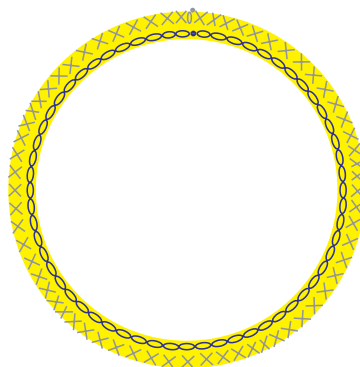

## KEY

## HERE'S HOW

### Circle



**Step 1** With A, make a slip knot onto the hook and chain 61. Make 1 single crochet in the 2nd chain from the hook, make 1 single crochet in each of the next 10 chain, then make 2 single crochet in the next chain, \*make 1 single crochet in each of the next 11 chain, make 2 single crochet in the next chain; repeat from \* 3 more times – you'll have 65 single crochet stitches. Fasten off.

Lay the piece you just made onto a flat surface. Making sure you keep the piece untwisted, tie the yarn tails together to make the piece into a big circle.

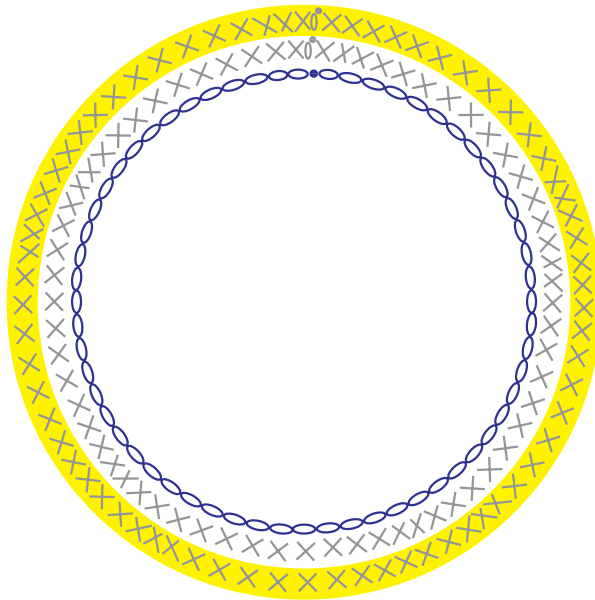
### Terms

**sc** = single crochet

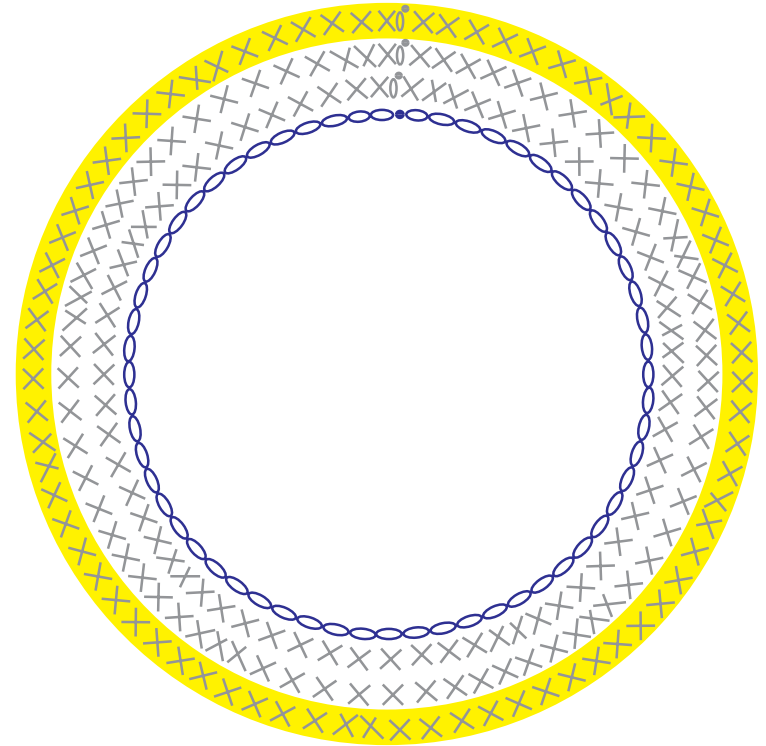
**turn** = turn your piece around so that the side that was facing you is now facing away from you.

For Steps 2-5, change the yarn color you're working with as desired. London didn't always change color at the beginning of a step – she just changed when inspiration struck!

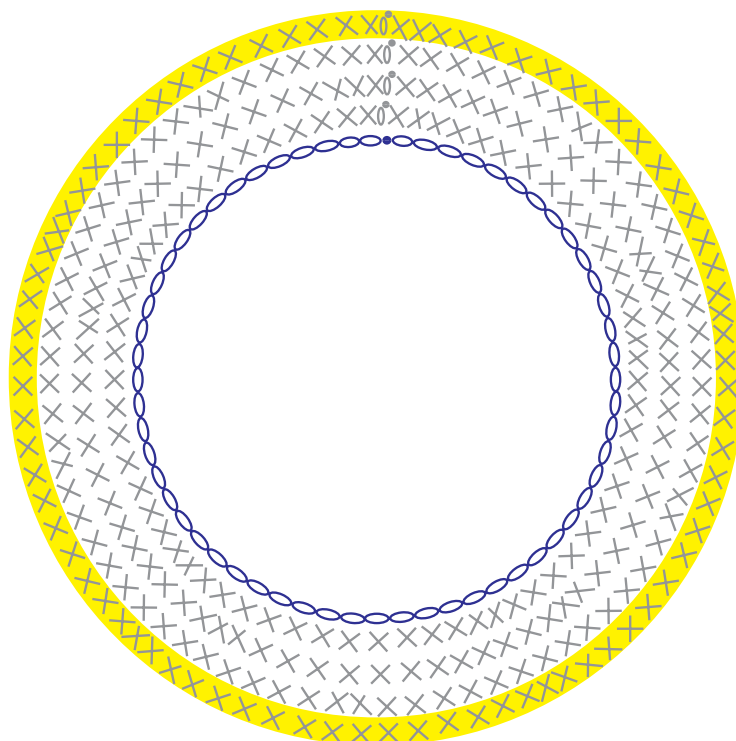
To change the yarn color as you work, fasten off the old color yarn. Join the new color with a slip stitch and continue with the new color.



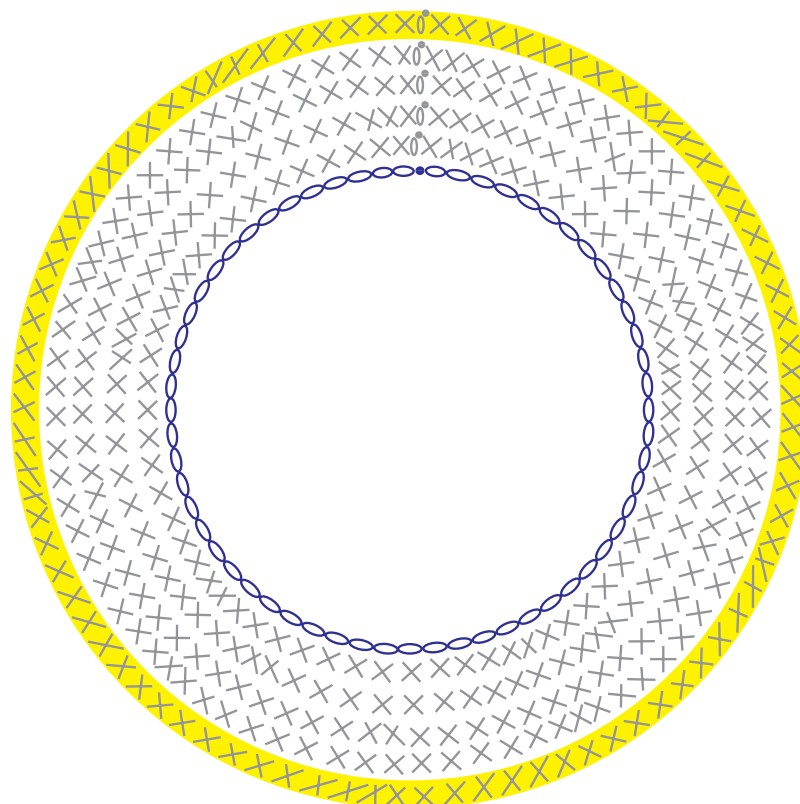
**Step 2** Join any yarn color with a slip stitch in any sc of Step 1. Chain 1, \*make 2 sc in the next sc, make 1 sc in each of the next 12 sc; repeat from \* 4 more times, slip stitch in first sc to join – you'll have 70 sc.



**Step 3** Chain 1, make 1 sc in each of the next 6 sc, \*make 2 sc in the next sc, make 1 sc in each of the next 13 sc; repeat from \* 3 more times, make 2 sc in the next sc, make 1 sc in each of the next 7 sc, slip stitch in first sc to join – you'll have 75 sc.



**Step 4** Chain 1, \*make 1 sc in each of the next 14 sc, make 2 sc in the next sc; repeat from \* 4 more times, slip stitch in first sc to join – you'll have 80 sc.



**Step 5** Chain 1, make 1 sc in each of the next 7 sc, \*make 2 sc in the next sc, make 1 sc in each of the next 15 sc; repeat from \* 3 more times, make 2 sc in the next sc, make 1 sc in each of the next 8 sc, slip stitch in first sc to join – you'll have 85 sc.

Fasten off.

## Center Line



**Step 6** With any yarn color, make a slip knot onto the hook and chain 23.  
Make 1 sc in the 2nd chain from hook, then make 1 sc in each of the next 21 chain, changing yarn color as you work – you'll have 22 sc.



**Step 7** Chain 1, turn, make 1 sc in each of the 22 sc, changing yarn color as desired.

Fasten off.

## Slanting Lines

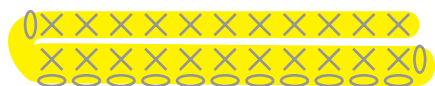


**Step 8** With any yarn color, make a slip knot onto the hook and chain 12. Make 1 sc in the 2nd chain from hook, then make 1 sc in each of the next 10 chain, changing yarn color as desired – you'll have 11 sc.



**Step 9** Chain 1, turn, make 1 sc in each of the sc, changing yarn color as desired.

Fasten off.



**Step 10** Repeat Steps 8 and 9 to make a second slanting line.

Glue yarn ends to back of pieces.

Glue ends of the center and slanting lines to the circle to make a peace sign.
