Road to Hana in Maui
Hawaii, USA

The most well-known grove of rainbow eucalyptus is on the 65-mile Road to Hana on Maui Island, Hawaii. These trees can quickly grow to more than 6 feet wide by 200 feet tall. The best time to visit is right after a rain when the wood has the deepest version of its colors.

IMAGINE: GNOMES

A GNOME IS A MINIATURE SPIRIT

in Renaissance magic and alchemy. They were first introduced in the 16th century and later accepted by more recent authors, including those of modern fantasy literature.

THE FIRST GARDEN GNOME

was created in Switzerland. It was later introduced to the United Kingdom in 1847 by Sir Charles Isham, when he brought 21 terracotta figures back from a trip to Germany and placed them around the gardens of his home.

PEOPLE HAVE BEEN KNOWN TO

"return to the wild" these garden gnomes, most notably France's "Front de Liberation des Nains de Jardins" and Italy's "MALAG" (Garden Gnome Liberation Front).

Some kidnapped garden gnomes have been sent on trips around the world, being passed from person to person and photographed at different famous landmarks, with the photos being returned to the owner.

WONDER: RAINBOW EUCALYPTUS TREE

THE RAINBOW EUCALYPTUS IS A

very tall perennial tree native to some South East Asia islands, including some parts of Indonesia, Philippines and New Guinea, and is the only eucalyptus tree native to the Northern Hemisphere.

THE TREE GROWS UP TO

250 feet tall in its native environment. In the U.S., rainbow eucalyptus trees grow in frost-free climates such as Hawaii and the southern portions of California, Texas and Florida.

THE BARK APPEARS TO BE BRUSH STROKES OF ARTISTS,

as if brilliant strokes of paint were splashed freely across a canvas in seven-hued rainbow colors.

THE BARK OF A RAINBOW EUCALYPTUS

sheds at different rates throughout the year.
