## **WONDER: FROZEN BUBBLE LAKES**

THE UNUSUAL AND FASCINATING BUBBLES
you see under the surface on a frozen lake are methane gas being
released from decaying plants and other organic matters
at the bottom of the lake or a pond. As the gas rises to the top,
it freezes and becomes a wonderful phenomenon as it
comes into contact with the frozen water.

WHEN SUMMER TIME ROLLS AROUND, the trapped bubbles simply pop when they reach the surface and enter the atmosphere.

#### METHANE GAS

that is trapped within these bubbles is incredibly flammable.

It traps heat 25 times more than carbon dioxide.

If there is a crack in the ice, the odorless methane gas will be release, so do not hold a match or a lighter nearby.
