Handling: Peel the strip off from the transparent liner. Apply the strip to under your eyes smoothly. Allow the strip to dry for about 10 to 15 minutes, reducing fine lines and wrinkles around eyes by penetrating effective ingredients continuously as it dries. After the strip is dried, slowly and carefully remove the strip from the edges.

Storage: Store in a cool, dry, well-ventilated area away from incompatible substances. Keep away from children.
