

## The YHWH

The YHWH is a fork tuned to the frequency of the ineffable, unspeakable, unpronounceable, and most important name of G\_d. When it is Spoken, Some refer to this also as Yahweh and others (mostly Christians) as Jehovah. This fork is used to frame up your world. Because it is a weighted fork it can also be used to spike nitric oxide when used on the body to relax the tissues and reduce inflammation.

The Jewish people often use this to frame up their lives within the four faces of God. They begin by facing East and shouting "Yod" which represents the lion. Then they face South and shout "Hey" which represents the Ox. Then they face west and shout "Vav" which represents the Eagle. Then they face north and shout "Hey" which represents man. Then they stay in the same spot and shout Yod Hey Shin Vav Hey. Shin represents the Messiah who is in the middle. We (mankind) are inside Shin and Shin is in Him. In Jewish belief that Messiah has yet to come. In Christian belief the Messiah is believed to have come.

This fork can be used in a variety of ways. As listed above, you can use this to frame your world by activating the fork when facing each direction. It can be used in prayer and meditation. As it is also a low Otto (weighted) fork, you can activate the fork and place the stem on pressure or reflex points. Many clients say they feel much more relaxed and calm after the fork has been used.

The Jewish hand symbol used to frame up one's world is the same one Leonard Nimoy used to signify "Live long and prosper" on Star Trek.
