



To complete the flowers and greenery you will need:

- *Heartgrooves Handmade Anemone Arrangement Felt Flower Kit
- *Hot glue gun (high heat mini glue gun recommended)
- *Glue sticks
- *Scissors (preferably sharp)
- *Floral wire, project base, faux greenery and any other supplies needed to complete the project.

Kit Contents:

All felt used is high quality wool blend felt and has been pre cut into shapes using a die cut machine. The kit includes materials to make:

- *A winter rose with 12 petals
- *A poinsettia with a metallic gold center or pointed petal succulent with 12 petals
- *An ombre ranunculus with 21 petals and a felt ball center
- *3 berry, pine and dusty miller sprigs



Winter Rose:



- *Note that the narrow portion of these petals are the bottom and the wavy side is the top.
- *Place a dot of glue in the bottom corner of a petal.
- *Fold over and pinch to start rolling.
- *Glue along bottom and roll to form a "trumpet".
- *Glue along the bottom of another petal and place around the first petal by lining up the bottom center and wrapping it around, allowing the edges to move upwards to form a cup. The petals will be overlapping quite a bit.
- *Repeat this step and adhere a 3rd petal but on the opposite side of the 2nd petal.
- *Now glue 3 petals evenly spaced around this flower center using the same technique.
- *Glue another 3 petals alternating with the last layer of petals.

*Add layers of 3 in this fashion until 12 petals have been used.

*This flower will be large and seem floppy, you can add glue to the inside of the flower to make it more sturdy if desired.

*The bottom of the petals can be trimmed before assembling to make the flower shorter if desired. This is helpful when creating a banner.

Ombre Ranunculus:



* Organize circles from light to dark color, 6 circles of light color, 9 circles of middle color and 6 circles of the darkest color. The flower can start with either the light or the dark color.

*Prepare the circles by cutting the first 2 piles almost in half. The last pile which will be the final layer, or outside of the flower, just cut a little sliver off of the bottom.

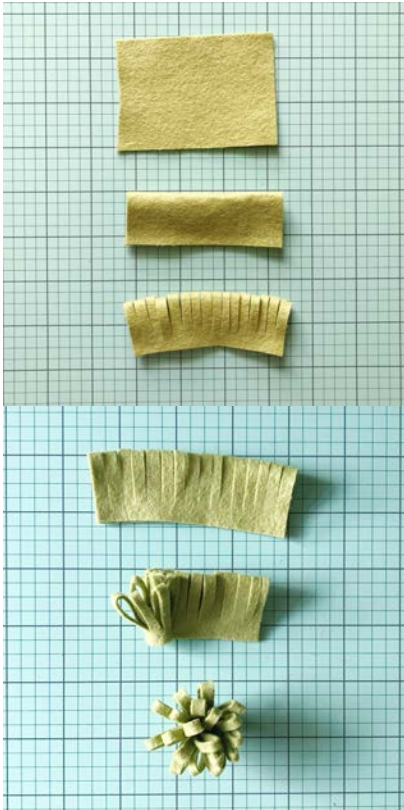
* For the first layer of petals, glue 3 of the circles entirely to the felt ball evenly around with a little of the felt ball peeking out of the top. The petals will form a triangle.

* The next 3 petals will alternate with the last layer. Place glue on the petal a little bit further down so that a little of the curve is not glued completely down. This will start making the flower look like it is opening up.

* Start on the middle 9 petals by continuing to add in layers of 3 alternating with the last layer each time. Keep the tops of the petals even. For each layer put glue further down the circle so that more of the top of the petal is loose.

* For the final layer, place the 6 petals evenly around to fill out the flower, putting glue only along the flat bottom of the circle.

Poinsettia:



- *To create the center of the poinsettia, use the small metallic gold rectangle
- *Carefully run hot glue across one of the long edges of the felt
- *Fold in half long ways (like a hot dog)
- *Snip on folded edge all the way across, leaving about 1/8" border on the bottom uncut. Snips don't have to be even or a particular width
- *Place a dot of hot glue on one of the uncut bottom corners
- *Fold over and pinch to start rolling
- *Keep rolling using dots of glue as needed
- *Use a dot of glue to secure the end once you're done rolling



- *To prepare petals, snip one end off of each leaf shape. Put in 2 piles of 3 and 1 pile of 6 petals
- *The first pile of 3 will be the first layer. Cut a small slit upwards from the flat bottom
- *With a dot of glue, overlap the sections on either side of the slit to create some dimension.
- *Glue the petals evenly around the small gold center, forming a triangle.
- *Using the second pile of 3, glue these petals to the bottom alternating with the first layer. Keep the petal tips even around the flower.
- *The final layer will be the pile of 6 petals, glue these to the bottom in all 6 spaces created by the first 2 layers. Keep the tips at least even or a little higher to create a slightly larger looking flower.

Pointed Petal Succulent (alternative to Poinsettia):

- *Start by snipping one end of each leaf shape, about 1/4 inch to create a flat side, this will create the bottom side of the flower.
- *Place a dot of glue in the corner of the flat side of a petal.
- *Fold over and pinch to start rolling.
- *Glue along flat edge and roll to form a "trumpet".
- *Glue along the bottom of another petal and place around the first petal by lining up the bottom center and wrapping it around, allowing the edges to move upwards to form a cup. The petals will be overlapping quite a bit.
- *Repeat this step and adhere a 3rd petal but on the opposite side of the 2nd petal.
- *Now glue 3 petals evenly spaced around this flower center using the same technique.
- *Glue another 3 petals alternating with the last layer of petals.
- *Add layers of 3 in this fashion until 12 petals have been used.



Berry Leaf Sprig:

- *Using one of the small leaf shapes, start by placing a dot of glue right at the base.
- *Place floral wire in the glue and pinch the leaf around the floral wire.
- *Pinch the next leaf the same way but without adding the floral wire.
- *Glue the pinned leaf to the side of the leaf on the floral wire.
- *Repeat this with the 3rd leaf.
- *Glue small felt ball to the center of the 3 leaves.
- *Repeat to make a total of 3 berry sprigs.



Dusty Miller Sprig:

- *Glue floral wire down the center of the dusty miller sprig, repeat for all 3 sprigs.

Pine sprig:



*Using the rectangle of felt, cut fringe across the long edge.

*Place a dot of hot glue on one of the bottom corners.

*Place floral wire in glue.

*Fold over and pinch to start rolling.

*Roll downwards on floral wire using dots of glue as needed.

*Use a dot of glue to secure the end once you're done rolling.

Putting it all together:
