

## The Case of Santa's Broken Bauble!

There's outrage at the North Pole. Santa has just got back to his office after a successful Christmas delivering this year's presents to find that someone has smashed his mystic bauble!! This bauble was so magical that all he had to do was look into it and say a child's name, and he would be able to see just what they wanted for Christmas.

He has tried to piece it back together, but the magic has now gone... and a piece is missing! His head Elf, Noel, can arrange for another one to be made, but the paperwork takes two years to complete. If we don't find the missing piece and fix the bauble, there will be no Christmas in 2023!

Santa has taken a good look around his office and workshop and has put together an evidence board. Something like this has never happened at the North Pole, so there's no crime department. Yule have to help him find out who did this and why. Was it an elf? Was it an accident? Or was it something else all together?

### What to do:

Over the first 10 days of your 12 days of Christmas puzzle, you'll receive a question. You must write your answer into the spaces provided. Your answer should fit into the spaces exactly. If your answer is more than one word, leave no spaces.

Then, enter the highlighted letters of your answer onto Santa's evidence board in the order they're highlighted. The questions are lettered (the first one A, the second B, and so on), so you must find the correct part of the board to record your answer in.

On the final two days you will receive some extra puzzles which will reveal how you can piece this puzzle together.

### Example:
