mail

Vocabulary extension

mailbag a bag in which mail is transported.

mailbox a post box, letterbox, or place in which mail is placed either for

delivery or collection.

mailed past tense of the verb to mail.

mailing list a list of names and addresses to which information, etc. is sent.

mail-order buying things by mail.

tail

Vocabulary extension

tailgate(tailboard) the board at the back of a truck, wagon, etc.

tailgater someone who drives too close to the vehicle in front.

tail end the final part, the rear part of anything

tailing following the residue of mining processes, etc. tail-light the red light at the rear of a vehicle, train etc.

tailpipe exhaust pipe on a vehicle

tail spin a sudden collapse into a state of confusion, a flat spin

tail wind a following wind which allows for increased speed for a vessel or an aircraft

tailor one whose business is to make clothes, usually for men.

tailor-made made by a tailor for an individual customer.

tailer someone employed to tend cattle, or to track down and bring in stray cattle.

Sayings and Expressions

To tail someone means to follow and not lose sight of someone.

To turn tail means to turn and run away.

With his tail between his legs means to be downcast, dejected, e.g., like a dog.

To put salt on the tail means to catch or apprehend someone or something.

With a sting in its tail refers to a piece of writing, or a speech, which has a reprimand at the end.

Tail end Charlie is the person at the end of something, e.g., a gueue.

for power and as a rudder, e.g., fish as a rudder to steer, e.g., platypus

for balance, e.g., kangaroo

to store food, e.g., the platypus and the fat tailed dunnart

to hang on with, e.g., monkeys, possums
