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Additional comments: Tisserand and Young cite comments made by IFRA in their 2013 volume of Essential oil Safety for Health Professionals, with specific reference to citronella oil.

They give differing opinions of guidelines, based on thoughts about methyl eugenol content, as follows

EU 0.01% IFRA 0.02% Tisserand & Young No limit

However, IFRA's 49th amendment concerning methyl euganol is later (2020), and perhaps should be seen as superseding that.

They also quote the maximum dermal use level (based on geraniol content) as follows:
