## Cutting

WOF = Width of Fabric
From Fabric A, cut:
(8) $4^{1 / 4^{\prime \prime}} \times 4^{1 / 4^{\prime \prime}}$ squares

From Fabrics $B, C$, and $E$, cut from each:
(6) $4^{1 / 4^{\prime \prime}} \times 4^{1 / 4^{\prime \prime}}$ squares

From Fabrics $D, F$, and $H$, cut from each:
(2) $9^{\frac{1}{2}}{ }^{\prime \prime} \times 9^{1 / 2}$ " squares
(6) $4^{1 / 4} 4^{\prime \prime} \times 4^{1 / 4^{" 1}}$ squares

From Fabric G, cut:
(2) $9^{1 / 2 "} \times 9^{1 / 2 "}$ squares
(2) $4^{1 / 4} 4^{\prime \prime} \times 4^{1 / 4} 4^{\prime \prime}$ squares

## From Fabric I, cut:

(8) $9^{1 / 2 "} \times 9^{1 / 2 "}$ squares, fussy cut around each motif

## From Fabric J, cut:

(2) 14 " $\times 45$ " panels, fussy cut along the selvages centered on the birds (17) $2^{1 / 4 "}$ - wide bias strips from the remaining striped center area (alternate option: from another fabric, cut (8) $2^{1} / 2^{\prime \prime} \times$ WOF strips for straight-grain binding)

## From Fabric K, cut:

(12) $2^{3 / 8} 8^{\prime \prime} \times$ WOF; sub-cut
(184) $2^{3 / 8} \times 2^{3 / 8}$ " squares
(5)2" x WOF; sub-cut
(20) $2^{\prime \prime} \times 9^{1 / 2 "}$ rectangles
(7) $2^{1 / 2} 2^{\prime \prime} \times$ WOF for outer border

## Instructions

All seam allowances are $1 / 4$ " and pieces are sewn right sides together. Press seam allowances open unless otherwise stated.

1. Draw a line on the wrong side of each Fabric $K 23 / 8^{\prime \prime} \times 23 / 8^{\prime \prime}$ square. Pin a pair of marked squares to opposite corners of a Fabric A $4^{1 / 4^{\prime \prime} \times 4^{1 / 4 "} \text { square as shown, with the corners overlapping }}$ at the center. Sew $1 / 4$ " on each side of the line, then cut apart on line to make (2) A Units. Press open. (Fig. 1)

2. Pin a Fabric K $2^{3} / 8^{\prime \prime}$ square to the corner of each A Unit as shown. Sew $1 / 4$ " on each side of the line. Cut apart on the line and press open to make (4) Flying Geese units. If needed, trim to 2" $\times 3^{1 / 2} 2^{\prime \prime}$. (Fig. 2)

Repeat with Fabrics A-G to make the following quantities of Flying Geese units:
(29) Fabric A (the technique makes 32, you will only need 29)
(24) each Fabrics B, C, D, E, F, and H
(8) Fabric G

3. Sew (7) Flying Geese together as shown into Sashing units. Sew (4) Sashing units together, then add a Fabric A Flying Geese Unit to the end of each to complete a Sashing Strip. Make (3). (Fig. 3)

4. Sew (6) Sashing units together as shown to make a side border. Sew a Fabric A Flying Geese Unit to only one end of the border, then add a pair of Fabric G Flying Geese Units to each end to make a side border. Make (2). (Fig. 4 below)

## Quilt Top Assembly

Follow the Quilt Layout diagram (page 5) while assembling the quilt. Press seam allowances towards the Sashing Strips and rectangles. Measure the Quilt Center width and height before cutting and adding borders and adjust border measurements if necessary to match your measurements.
5. Arrange the $99^{1 / 2} \times 9^{1 / 2 "}$ squares in columns, making sure all the fussy-cut squares are oriented correctly. Sew the $9^{1 / 2 "} \times 9^{1 / 2 "}$ squares together into columns, with Fabric K 2" $\times 9^{1 / 2 "}$ sashing rectangles between each and at the top and bottom of each column as shown. Sew the block columns and Flying Geese Sashing Strips together to complete the quilt center.
6. Sew the Fabric J panels to the top and bottom of the quilt center, so that the birds' heads are towards the center of the quilt.
7. Sew together all the Fabric K WOF strips end-to-end. Cut (2) side outer border strips 75" long and (2) top/bottom outer border strips 5112" long.
8. Sew the Flying Geese side borders to the sides of the quilt top. Sew the Fabric K $51^{1} /{ }^{\prime \prime}$-long strips to the top and bottom, press, then sew the Fabric K 75 "-long strips to the left and right sides to complete the quilt top.

## Finishing

9. Sew together the $2^{1 / 1} 4^{"}$ Fabric J bias binding strips end-to-end using diagonal seams (or use the $2^{1 / 2 "} \times$ WOF strips if you chose not to fussy-cut bias binding.) Press seams open. Press the binding strip in half wrong sides together.
10. Layer backing (wrong side up), batting, and quilt top (right side up). Baste the layers together and quilt as desired. Trim excess batting and backing even with the top after quilting is completed.
11. Leaving an 8 " tail of binding, sew the binding to the top of the quilt through all layers matching all raw edges. Miter corners. Stop approximately 12 " from where you started. Lay both loose ends of binding flat along quilt edge. Where the loose ends meet, fold them back on themselves and press to form a crease. Using this crease as your stitching line, sew the two open ends of the binding right sides together. Trim seam to $1 / 4^{\prime \prime}$ and press open. Finish sewing binding to quilt.
12. Turn the binding to the back of quilt and hand-stitch in place.
