Paragraph 8 of Marine Order 41 (*Carriage of Dangerous Goods*) 2009.

The requirements of which give effect to the mandatory training requirements for shore based personnel as prescribed in:

Chapter 1.3 of Volume 1 of the
International Maritime Dangerous Goods (IMDG) Code (2012 edition)

This acceptance relates to the "AMSA Accepted" training that is to be provided to shore based personnel who undertake any of the following functions:

- i. Packing of dangerous goods, [including those that supervise the packing of Cargo Transport Units];
- ii. Marking, labelling or placarding of dangerous goods; and
- iii. Preparing and signing transport documentation [shipper and container packing declarations].

This acceptance is issued in respect of the following electronic training package and cannot be applied to a similar packages, or different versions of the same package, by analogy. If accepted, such packages will be subject to a separate certificate:

CONDITIONS:

- 1 This acceptance only relates to the Webinar version and requires **the pass mark of 85% to be achieved.**
2. This certificate is issued in respect of the 2012 edition of the IMDG code and a verification audit will be required when the training packages are updated to the next edition of the IMDG code.

3. The certificate number of this acceptance certificate is to be included on all training records issued in relation to it where the training is to be relied upon by shore based personnel engaged in the transport of dangerous goods intended to be shipped by sea from Australia.
4. A copy of this acceptance certificate is to be provided to users of the training course upon request.
5. Where the Webinar method is employed to comply with the training requirements of Chapter 1.3 of the IMDG code the trainer is to have a system in place that ensures students can be identified and ensures the individual in question has completed the assessments. Details of this system are to be documented and available for audit by a surveyor upon request; and
6. Where the specified package is employed to comply with the training requirements of Chapter 1.3 of the IMDG Code the trainer is to ensure that **every student** has a copy of the IMDG code (2012 edition) available to them **at all times** when using the package. There is to be evidence that this has been complied with and this is to be available for audit to a surveyor upon request.

Subject to the conditions this acceptance certificate shall remain valid for **Dangerous Goods Training International** until the **31st of December 2015**, unless it is withdrawn or altered for any reason before that date.
