


Use this guide to identify the *new sounds* and *digraphs* introduced at each level of the **Fitzroy Readers** and **Fitzroy Word Skills**.

The Fitzroy Program is a complete P-6 phonic literacy resource. Nine sets of ten sequential readers form the core of the program. The accompanying Word Skills workbooks provide activities that focus on each new sound and/or digraph introduced in the readers, as well as spelling, grammar, comprehension and creative English exercises.

Please note that the Fitzroy Readers also gradually introduce the 50+ most common 'special words' (non-phonic). Some phonic words are called special words when first encountered, but become sounding words later when a reader has been devoted to their digraph.
