

Front cover

Discussion

The cover is what we call the front of the book.

Who can you see on the cover?

What kind of animals do you see?

Where are they?

Whose names are on the cover?

The name of the author and illustrator – what are their names?

Activities

Find out about shows and fairs – is there a local show or fair, what is there to see and do, what competitions would you like to compete in if there was a fair in school?



Inside spread

Discussion

Talk about the text and picture on these pages.

Discuss the place to put your name – why would you do that?



Pages 2 & 3

Discussion

Do you have a radio at home?

What do you like to listen to?

Can you see Peter the cat - where is he?

It is a fine day in the story – what is the weather like here today?

Activities

Make a weather chart that can be changed by placing weather symbols on it – roleplay being a weatherperson and record to show on the interactive whiteboard.



Pages 4 & 5

Discussion

Peter does not like dogs very much.

Do you like dogs? Do you have a dog? What is his/her name?



Pages 6 & 7

Discussion

Gaspard and Peter are off on an adventure to look for Finty the dog.

Where would you go first to try to find someone – what clues would you have to help you?

Activities

Play guessing games by giving clues – eg it is small, it is a toy, it bounces – what is it?



Pages 8 & 9

Discussion

They have arrived at the park – what fun.

Do you enjoy going to the park?

What can you do there?

How many dogs can you count in the picture?

Activities

Decorate some cakes for a bake off competition or make some from playdoh and clay.



Pages 10 & 11

Discussion

Oh dear, was the dog friendly towards Gaspard?

How did Gaspard feel?

Would you feel frightened as well?

Activities

Place lots of materials, scarves, hats, glasses and bags in a box for dressing up activities.



Pages 12 & 13

Discussion

Look at Gaspard – doesn't he look splendid?

What would you like to dress up as in a fancy dress competition?

Activities

Paint pictures of themselves in their favourite fancy dress costume – it could have a theme.



Pages 14 & 15

Discussion

Gaspard has found Finty.

What do you think of her costume?

Oh dear, Peter was right about what dogs do.

What else can you see in this picture?

Activities

Find out about pirates and musketeers, watch clips of them and describe how they look.



Pages 16 & 17

Discussion

What do you think is happening now?

Can you see the church in the background? There are lots of people watching the show.

Are there more than 10 or less?

Activities

Make a pattern collage using the same pattern but in different colours or swap patterns on things, for example, a flowery zebra a starry giraffe.



Pages 18 & 19

Discussion

What is your favourite part on these pages?

Do you see the patterns – stripes, flowery.





Pages 20 & 21

Discussion

Gaspard and Finty are play acting.

The crowd are amazed how clever they are.

What are you good at doing?

Activities

Create a celebration wall with pictures of the children doing things they are proud of at home or in school.



Pages 22 & 23

Discussion

Hurray! Gaspard has won the competition.

What other competitions can you think of? Sports, drawing, cooking, baking.



Pages 24 & 25

Discussion

The bouncy castle has popped like a giant balloon.

Why did it make the whooshing noise? What is inside it?

Activities

Play balloon games outdoors – keep the balloon in the air/pass the balloon with chopsticks.



Pages 26 & 27

Discussion

What is happening now?

Are they having a race?

There are lots of dogs – how many do you see?



Pages 28 & 29

Discussion

Look at themes – what is happening to Peter?

Do you think the people will be angry?

Activities

Think about being a good friend. Write on some tags what things you could do to be a good friend and tie them to your friendship branch or tree.





Pages 30 & 31

Discussion

Gaspard had his rosette again.

Have you won anything in a competition?

What was it?

What did you do to win it?



Pages 32 & 33

Discussion

Find out about the author and illustrator.

Learn about the fox's year and the musketeers.

Activities

Create a small world imaginative play area in a tough tray. Fill it with leaves and mosses in one half and buildings and roads in the other. Add in woodland animals, pets and people and create new stories.



Back cover

Discussion

Talk about the information on the back cover.

Explain the ISBN number.

What was your favourite part of the book?
