

Activities

Find another book with a dedication.

What can you see in the picture?


What is on the floor?

Pages 6 & 7

Discussion

Who do you see?

What does Rita think she needs?

What would you ask a fairy godmother to do for you?

Count the magic stars.

Activities

What other magical characters do we know about? Let's find out and create a display.



Pages 8 & 9

Discussion

Where is Rita's mother?

What pattern is on Rita's jumper?

What about Mum's blouse?

Activities

Look for patterns in magazines and old newspapers and create a pattern collage.

Create a spotty zebra or a stripey mouse.



Pages 10 & 11

Discussion

How many pictures of Rita do you see?

What is Rita doing? Eating.

What is your favourite snack?

Activities

Play a dress the teddy game or organise clothes into piles/pairs.



Pages 12 & 13

Discussion

Can you see all of Rita's costumes?

Which one is your favourite?

Activities

Make costumes from pieces of fabric and recycled paper – put on a fashion show.



Pages 14 & 15

Discussion

Where are Rita's friends playing?

How many are there?

Does Rita want to play?

Activities

Visit a local park or create a park from straws and plasticine for the small world.



Pages 16 & 17

Discussion

Which shoes do we wear to play, jump in puddles, dance?

Activities

Decorate an old shoe with new patterns.

Create a shoe shop role play area.



Pages 18 & 19

Discussion

Where is Rita in the picture?

Is she happy?

Activities

Investigate the clothes different people wear for their work.



Pages 20 & 21

Discussion

Who is in this picture with Rita?

What are they having for tea?

How many are there?

Activities

Create a recipe book – ask the children to bring their favourite recipes into school and create a book.



Pages 22 & 23

Discussion

What is Rita doing in the pictures?

Which of these is your favourite thing to do?

Activities

Ask the children for their ideas for new things to do indoors/outdoors.



Pages 24 & 25

Discussion

What is happening in the picture?

Is Rita happy?

Activities

Play different activities outdoors – crate baskets and boxes of resources for outdoor play.



Pages 26 & 27

Discussion

What story does this remind you of?

Who is Rita in this picture?

Activities

Create a wand to roleplay magical worlds.

Discussion

What is Rita thinking?

Activities

Create a feelings poem for the class.

We're happy when...

Were sad when...

Were excited when...

Rita has changed her mind.

Would you do the same?

Is she doing things for herself?

Activities

Create a chores list of ways you can help at home.



Pages 34 & 35


Discussion
