## MATERIALS:

1-Full sized Skein of Tangled Poets Backpacker (450 yards) (MC) Several Tangled Poets Hiku's(Mni Skeins-110 yards) Sample used6Hiku's 3.75mmcircular needle, 24inches

Total yardage: $1110(1110,1110,1220,1220,1330,1330,1440,1440)$
GQUGE: 22stitchesand 19 rows $=10$ cminstockinettestitch
SIZES: 36, (38, 40, 42, 44, 46, 48, 50, 52) chest measurement, sweater requires no ease.

The fun of thissweateris, your creativity canlead the pathto something absolutely brilliant. Thehard part isdeciding which colourtouse next. The sweater isknit from thetopdowntomakeit very customizabletoyou

THE YOKE:
Wth 3.75 mneedle and amini skein of your choice, cast on 86 ( $929,96,102,108,108$, $112,118,124)$, pm and joinintheround being careful not totwist.

Wbrkin<br>, Pl ribfor 6rows Ot yarn andset thismini asidefor the cuff of your sleeveslateron

Attach the full-sizedskein (MC), Knit one row and thenattach the secondmini of yar choosing Fromthispoint on the full-sizedskein will remain constant, andthemini's will be addedasyouga.

## WORK YOUR FIRST INCREASE ROW AS FOLLOWS:

Thissectionisworked with (1) stitchinMC, and 1stitchin $œ$ ), whenincreasing, besure tokeepthe colorpattern

Increase asfollows (12, M) repeat until the end of the round dependingonsize, you may have an extrastitch, knit it! Beingsuretokeep colour pattemintact.

Wbrkuntil the piecemeasures 2 ( $225,225,25,25,25,25,25,275$ ) inchesfromthe cast onedge, continuingin color pattern Break $\propto$.

## WORK SECOND INCREASE ROW AS FOLLOWS:

Attachthenext mini. (CC)
Thissectionisworked with (1st inMC, and 2stitchesin $\propto$ ), whenincreasing besure tokeepthe color patter, TheMCshouldremaininthe sameplacement.

Increase asfollows (12, M) repeat until the end of the round, depending onsize, you may have an extrastitch, knit it! Beingsuretokeep color patternintact.

Whrkuntil the piecemeasures 4 ( $4.5,4.5,4.75,5,5,5,5,5,25$ ) inchesfromthe cast on edge, continuingincolourpattern Break@.

## WORK THIRD INCREASE ROW AS FOLLOWS:

Attachthenext mini ( $(C)$
Thissectionisworked with (1 stitchinMC, and 1 stitchin $C$ ), whenincreasingbesure tokeepthe color pattern The MCshouldremaininthe sameplacement.

Increase asfollows (KK, M) repeat until the end of the round, depending on size, you may have an extrastitch knit it! Beingsuretokeep colourpattemintact.

Wbrkuntil the piecemeasures 6 , (6.5, 6.75, 7, 7.25, 7.25, 7.25, 7.5, 7.5) inchesfromthe cast onedge, continuingin colour pattern Break $\propto$

## WORK FOURTH INCREASE ROW AS FOLLOWS:

Attachthenext mini ( $\propto$ )
Thissectionisworked with (1 stitchinMC, 1 stitchin $\propto$, 1 stichinMC, and 2 stitchesin $\propto$ ), whenincreasing be suretokeepthe colour pattern TheMCshould remininthe sameplacement.

Increase asfollows (K4, M) repeat until the end of the round depending onsize, you may have anextrastitch, knit it! Beingsuretokeep color patternintact.

Workuntil the piecemeasures 8 (8.5, , , 9.25, 9.5, 9.5, 9.75, 10, 10.25) inches fromthe cast onedge, continuingin colour pattern Break $\propto$

Youarenowready toseparate the sleevesfromthe body. You've successfully completed your yoke. If yourstitch count is at a stitch ortwo, don't worry, if youhave anextra, put it inthesleeve.

Thissectionisworkedwith (1stitchinMC, 1 stitchin $\propto$, 1 stichinMC, and 2 stitches in $\propto$ ), whendividingthesleeves, be suretokeepthe colourpattem TheMCshould remaininthe sameplacement.

Attachyournext mini ( $C$ )
Workcolour patternfor $95,(105,110,115,120,120,120,125,135,140)$ stitches,
Placethe next $65,(70,75,80,80,80,85,90,90)$ stitches anto a piece of waste yam
Cast on $10,(10,10,10,10,15,15,15,15$ ) stitches
Whrk color patternfor $95,(105,110,115,120,120,120,125,135,140)$ stitches,
Place thenext $65,(70,75,80,80,80,85,90,90)$ stitches antoa piece of waste yarn
Cast on $10,(10,10,10,10,15,15,15,15)$ stitches Movingyour stitchmarkerfromit's current location, tothe middle of thesestitches. Thiswill be your newbeginning and end of round

Fromhear until the body measures $11,(11,11,11.5,125,125,1275,13,13,13,25,13.5)$, or2 incheslessthan desireslength, (you candeterminethisbetryingyour sweater on, and establishing where you want the bottomedgetosit). Youwill workthrough your stack of mini's, knitting until yourunout, then attachingthenext. For the twolargest sizes yourmay needtouse 2 minis, if youare running out of the full-sized skein

At thispoint break both MCand $\propto$, Attach a tonal mini for the bottomribbing. Wbrk 25 inches, inK2, P2 rib. Cast off in pattem

## SLEEVES:

Sleeves are worked with 2 mini skeins, usingthe colour pattemfromthe body, (1
stitchinMC, 1 stitchin $\mathbb{C}$, 1 stichinMC, and 2 stitchesin $\propto$ )
Feed the stitchesfromthe waste yarn ontoa circular needle or DPNs, then, pickup andknit $10,(10,10,10,10,15,15,15,15)$ stitches fromthe cast on edge inthe armpit.
Workintheroundmaintaining the colour pattern, for approx. 2 inches, Breakboth colours, and attach the mini skein you used for theneck, or another tonal of choice. And workinK, Pl ribfor 1.5 inches, cast off in pattem

Repeat thisprocessfor the second sleeve.
Block sweater tosmooth out all the colour work wear merrily.
