

# VIOLET & VERBENA

## Crescent Shawl



**A fun and cozy crescent shawl, made especially for our 2022 Holiday Box!**

\*\*\*Please note that the colours in the photos are not representative of those in the holiday box, we would hate to spoil the surprise\*\*\*

### Materials

**1 skein of Tangled Poets Backpacker (450 yards) fingering weight**

(Day 25 of holiday Box) (MC)-Main Colour

**5 Mini skeins of Tangled Poets Backpacker (110 yards each) in 5 different colours**

(Days 20-24 of Holiday Box) C1, C2, C3, C4, C5-Contrast Colours

**Stitch markers and finishing notions (darning needle, pins, etc.)**

**4.0mm circular needle, we recommend a 32" to accommodate the wingspan**

### Gauge & Size

Approx 20 sts per 4 inches once blocked.

One Size, wingspan measures 52 inches, by 22 inches of depth. (After blocking)

## **Garter Tab Start**

With (MC) Cast on 3 sts.

Knit 14 rows

Turn your work 90 degrees, and pick up 7 sts along the garter stitch edge

Turn your work 90 degrees, and pick up 3 sts along the end

You will now have 13 stitches on your needle.

(There are great visuals in the book in your holiday box with garter tab start, this one is simply bigger)

## **Section A: Worked entirely in MC**

Set up Row: K3, pm, purl to marker, pm, K3

First increase Row: K3, sm, (yo, k1) rep to marker, sm, K3

Next 3 rows work as follows:

K3, sm, p to m, sm, K3

K3, sm, k to m, sm, K3

K3, sm, k to m, sm, K3

Second Increase Row: K3, sm, (yo, k1) rep to marker, sm, K3

Next 5 Rows work as follows:

K3, sm, p to m, sm, K3

K3, sm, k to m, sm, k3

Rep these 2 rows once more

K3, sm, p to m, sm, K3

Third Increase Row: K3, sm, (yo, K1) rep to marker, sm, K3

Next 11 Rows work as follows:

K3, sm, p to m, sm, K3

K3, sm, k to m, sm, K3

Rep these 2 rows 4 more times

K3, sm, p to m, sm, K3

Fourth Increase Row: K3, sm, (yo, k1) rep to marker, sm, K3

## **Section B: Worked with MC and C1**

**With C1** Work the next 8 rows as follows:

K3, sm, p to m, sm, K3

K3, sm, k to m, sm, K3

Rep these 2 rows 3 more times

**The next 10 Rows are worked with MC and C1 as follows:**

**(MC)** K3, sm, p to m, sm, K3

**(MC)** K3, sm, k to m, sm, K3

**(C1)** K3, sm, pto m, sm, K3

**(C1)** K3, sm, k to m, sm, K3

Rep these 4 rows once more, then work

**(MC)** K3, sm, p to m, sm, K3

**(MC)** K3, sm, k to m, sm, k3

**With C1** work the next 9 rows as follows:

K3, sm, p to m, sm, K3

K3, sm, k to m, sm, K3

Rep these 2 rows 3 more times

K3, sm, p to m, sm, K3

**(MC)** Fifth Increase Row: K3, sm, (yo, K1) rep to marker, sm, K3

Work the next 2 rows as follows: **(MC)**

K3, sm, p to m, sm, K3

K3, sm, k to m, sm, K3

Work the next 4 rows as follows:

K3, sm, k to m, sm, K3

rep 3 more times

### **Begin Lace Section: (MC)**

Row 1: K3, sm, K4, pm, (k2tog) x 3, (yo, K1) x 6, (k2tog) x 3, pm, K4, sm, K3

Row 2: K3, sm, p4, sm, p to m, sm, p4, sm, K3

Row 3: K3, sm, k4, sm, k to m, sm, k4, sm, K3

Row 4: K3, sm, p4, sm, p to m, sm, k4, sm, K3

Repeat these 4 rows 2 more times

### **With C2**

Work the next 4 rows as follows

K3, sm, k to last marker, sm, K3, rep 3 more times

### **With C3**

Row 1: K3, sm, K4, pm, (k2tog) x 3, (yo, K1) x 6, (k2tog) x 3, pm, K4, sm, K3

Row 2: K3, sm, p4, sm, p to m, sm, p4, sm, K3

Row 3: K3, sm, k4, sm, k to m, sm, k4, sm, K3

Row 4: K3, sm, p4, sm, p to m, sm, k4, sm, K3

Repeat these 4 rows 1 more time

### **With C2**

Work the next 4 rows as follows

K3, sm, k to last marker, sm, K3, rep 3 more times

### **With MC**

Row 1: K3, sm, K4, pm, (k2tog) x 3, (yo, K1) x 6, (k2tog) x 3, pm, K4, sm, K3

Row 2: K3, sm, p4, sm, p to m, sm, p4, sm, K3

Row 3: K3, sm, k4, sm, k to m, sm, k4, sm, K3

Row 4: K3, sm, p4, sm, p to m, sm, k4, sm, K3

Repeat these 4 rows 2 more times

### **With MC**

Work the next 4 rows as follows

K3, sm, k to last marker, sm, K3, rep 3 more times

### **With C4**

Sixth Increase Row: K3, sm, (yo, K1) rep to last last marker, sm, K3

\*\*\*at this point you will have a lot of stitches on your needle, the stitch count should be 451.

In all the lace and yarn overs, it is easy to miss or add a stitch, the pattern is very forgiving, you will have the opportunity to increase or decrease as necessary later on.\*\*\*

Work the next rows as follows:

**(WS)** K3, sm, p to last marker, sm, K3

**(RS)** K3, sm, (yo, k2tog) rep to 1 st before the last marker, K1, sm, K3

**(WS)** K3, sm, k to last marker, sm, K3

Rep the last 2 rows 3 more times

### **With C2**

Work the next 4 rows as follows

K3, sm, k to last marker, sm, K3, rep 3 more times

### **With MC**

**(RS)** K3, sm, (yo, k2tog) rep to 1 st before the last marker, K1, sm, K3

**(WS)** K3, sm, k to last marker, sm, K3

Rep these rows 5 more times

### **With C3**

Work the next 4 rows as follows

K3, sm, k to last marker, sm, K3, rep 3 more times

(If your stitch count is slightly off, the last row of this section is where you can increase or decrease as needed)

### **With C5**

Work the next 16 rows as follows:

Row 1: K3, sm, p1, (p3, k5, p4) rep to last marker, sm, K3

**Row 2 and all WS rows:** K3, sm, k to last marker, sm, K3

Row 3: K3, sm, P2tog, (p2, k2, yo, k1, yo, k2, p2, P3tog) ending the last rep with P2tog, sm, K3

Row 5: K3, sm, P2tog, (p1, k2, yo, k1, yo, k2, p1, P3tog) ending the last rep with P2tog, sm, K3

Row 7: K3, sm, P2tog, (K2, yo, K5, yo, K3, P3tog) ending the last rep with P2tog, sm, K3

Row 8: as Row 2

### **With MC**

Work the next 2 rows as follows:

K3, sm, k to last marker, sm, K3

### **Finishing**

Bind off loosely (the easiest way to ensure the flexible edge is to use a 4.5 mm needle to bind off, if not, just be conscientious as you work your way through all those stitches).

Block your shawl, soak in cool water (please do not use any warm water) this will ensure that if there is any colour run off, it can't stick, and will just rinse away.

Block to measurements and pulling all tips along the edge.

Weave in the ends and wear with pride!
