## Ride On, King Jesus

African American Spiritual Arranged by Charles J. Torian, Jr.

An African American spiritual with words resembling *Ride On, King Jesus* was known during the American Civil War, though it remained unpublished until 1867 when it appeared as *No Man Can Hinder Me* in the collection <u>Slave Songs of the United States</u> (A. Simpson & Co., New York). The tune, however, is not one commonly heard today.

Five years later, in 1872, New York publishers Biglow and Main came out with <u>Jubilee Songs</u> Complete as Sung by the <u>Jubilee Singers of Fisk University</u> which contained an unaccompanied melody line with three verses of *Ride On, King Jesus*. It is this version that has gained wide acceptance and serves as the melodic basis for this arrangement. The piano accompaniment has been freely improvised.
