SECTION 4: FIRST AID MEASURES

4.1. Description of First Aid Measures

4.2. Most important symptoms and effects, both acute and delayed

5.3. Advice for Firefighters

Precautionary Measures Fire: Exercise caution when fighting any chemical fire.

Firefighting Instructions: Use water spray or fog for cooling exposed containers. In case of major fire and large quantities:

Evacuate area. Fight fire remotely due to the risk of explosion.
