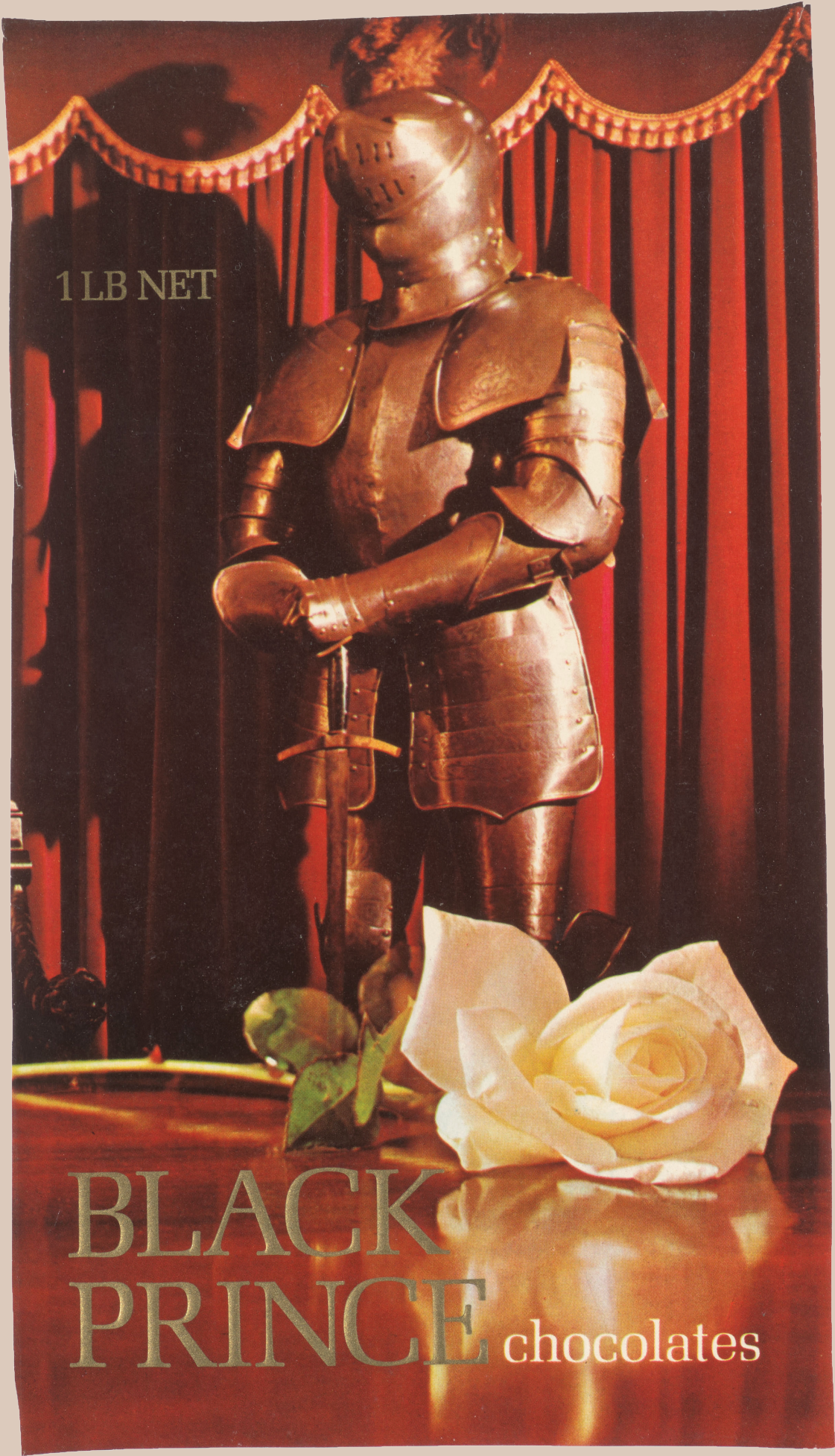
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Celebrating Mother's Day

Queen Anne shops celebrated the day with elaborate window displays featuring tiered boxes of chocolates, paper lace doilies and decorative cards, all carefully arranged to evoke warmth and affection. These displays drew in passers-by with their sentimental charm, showcasing Queen Anne Chocolates as the perfect gift for "a Mother just like you".

Boxes of chocolates were personalised with a Mother's Day paper sleeve which offered a heartfelt message "To Mother", making them a treasured keepsake.
