



## **FOR BEST RESULTS BURNING YOUR FIREWOOD:**

- *Always stack kiln dried firewood INSIDE for best results.*
- Stack your firewood as soon as possible! Stack seasoned and semi-seasoned wood outdoors. DO NOT stack in a cold garage or shed because you want air circulation to speed up the drying out of the wood.
- Stack wood in a sunny location with plenty of airflow, if possible.
- Avoid stacking wood in contact with the ground.
- Cover the top of the stack, leaving the sides open for air circulation.
- Have a rotation process going: Bring as much wood as you can into your home and store next to your fireplace or wood burning stove. Each time you have a fire, the heat will pull the moisture out of the firewood ready to go in next. Refill the supply as needed.

## **STARTING YOUR FIRE:**

- Even with the best firewood, you must use the proper techniques to start your fire. Begin with an ample supply of kindling wood and/or Fatwood. Ignite a few pieces of crumpled newspaper. When the kindling is burning well, add several pieces of firewood and wait until a bed of embers is created. Only when the small firewood has begun to burn well, should you add full-sized firewood.
- Wolf Hill carries Fatwood and kindling that can help you get your fire started faster.

## **\*\*\*DID YOU KNOW:**

- Firewood will burn only when the temperature of the wood reaches 600 degrees Fahrenheit. Attempts to burn a cold log without using a form of kindling other than paper will be unsuccessful.
