The Team has booked accommodation and cafeteria meals at the Carleton University <u>Lennox and Addington House</u> Residences. Meals (Breakfast/Lunch/Diner) are provided at Carleton University and

are provided to the team June 29-July 1. Athletes are responsible for meals on the day of arrival (Wednesday, June 28) and departure (Sunday, July 2). Athletes will walk between the residence to the competition site (2.5km) along the Rideau Canal to the Rideau Canoe Club.


Arriving from Calgary (or Montreal)

Athletes are responsible for any additional out-of-province medical insurance.

The ASRCA CCE event project begins Wednesday, June 28th in Ottawa. Ornmadee will be returning to Calgary after NTT and then flying back to Ottawa. Mike and many on the Team will be at NTT in Montreal the week before and make their way to Ottawa.

Athletes booking flights from Alberta should try to arrive in Ottawa before 8 pm to be met once they land. Please try and coordinate flights with other team members. Once in Ottawa, 18+ athletes may travel by taxi or Uber from the airport to the team's accommodations at Carleton University. Please communicate with coaches once in Ottawa. For U18 age team members, coaches will coordinate airport pick-ups/drop-offs; share your travel information with the coaching team.

Reasonable Return Flight Options are presented below. Other options may be possible, and flight availability and prices do change.




FROM MONTREAL - The NTT is organized as a club project, the CCE is a Provincial Team project, and these are two separate organizations. The NTT information is organized by the club or athlete directly. NTT racing takes place June 23-25 (Fri-Sun). The ASRCA CCE team project begins Wednesday, June 28th, and athletes are asked to arrive on this day. If NTT athletes stay in the region, they must

make arrangements until Wednesday, when they join the ASRCA CCE plan. In the past, we found the short trip from Montreal to Ottawa on VIA Rail easy and cost-friendly. <u>Tickets can be purchased online</u> by the athletes in advance. In 2022 the athletes stayed in Montreal for one day before moving to Ottawa, giving the athletes a chance to sightsee. Again, some athletes said they would like a day in Montreal to sightsee. The Calgary Canoe Club team booking for NTT has the athletes checking out of rooms the Monday following NTT. See the image below with the suggested Tuesday train if sightseeing in Montreal.



In Ottawa, Carleton University said they have space for those 'in-between' days (Mon, Tues) but must know by Thursday if we want to add extra nights to our team booking. The per-night room fee in Ottawa is \$41/night plus tax. Meals in the University Cafeteria can be requested for these days (Breakfast \$10.92, Lunch \$13.59, Dinner \$15.94 + tax).

Equipment (boats)

The ASRCA relies on boats drawn from member club inventories. Clubs will be asked to provide boats for the CCE team. Individuals named to the team and wanting to take private boats may do so. However, personal boats may be treated as' team' boats due to limited trailer space and to minimize boats taken from clubs. The specifics of the competition fleet will depend on the specific requirements of the athletes selected. Confirm with Mike or Ornmadee about your boat.

The Calgary Canoe Club Van and trailer will depart on Sunday, June 18^{th,} and attend the National Team Trials in Montreal the weekend before the CCE. All CCE team boats must be on the trailer; if an Alberta athlete is attending NTT but not the CCE, space is available in addition to the CCE boats. Owners must ensure private boats. Private boat owners are responsible for delivering their boats to and from Calgary. If Edmonton club boats are required, ASRCA will arrange transportation.

Authority

While on Team assignment with CCE Team, the coaches are the authority. Athletes must respect and follow the guidance of the coaching team. If increased or constant supervision is required, if the paddler struggles or needs to be chaperoned in mixed company, they should not accept a nomination. Athletes must work well with teammates. Coaches are very busy, and athletes must be able to function reliably and independently.

Coaches have sole discretion to determine Team AB entries. Results at ABT1 do not determine event entries at the CCE. For example, a win at ABT1 does not guarantee a singles entry at the CCE.

Athlete Fee

The cost per athlete is estimated at \$1250. With support from our partners, ASRCA has lowered the per athlete fee to \$400. Support is provided by the Calgary Canoe Club, Province of Alberta through the Canada Summer Games Training Grant, and ASRCA athlete development fund. Included in the per athlete cost are: race entry fees, team race shirt, accommodation, cafeteria meals, coach and trailer costs. Flight costs are the responsibility of the athletes.
