INTENDED USE

INDICAID™ Ovulation Rapid Test is an in vitro diagnostic test for the qualitative detection of the surge in luteinizing hormone (LH) in human urine samples. It is used as an aid in predicting ovulation time.

Luteinizing hormone (LH) in the urine of normal women will increase dramatically in the middle of the menstrual cycle. The LH increase triggers ovulation which is when the egg is released periodically from normal fertile women. Ovulation surge is likely to occur within 24-48 hours following a positive test. It is important to note that there may be no LH surge or ovulation during the cycle.

- Store in a dry place at 2-30°C


LIMITATIONS


- · This kit is a qualitative test and cannot be used to determine the amount of LH in the test.
- · This kit can only be used to test the level of LH in the urine. It cannot be used for the diagnosis and screening of ovulation. nor can it be used for the detection of other LH related to hormone secretion disorders.
- · Failure to follow the instructions may result in inaccurate test results.

Example: If your cycle is normally 28 days, the Cycle Chart indicates testing should begin on day 11 and perform the test for consecutive 5 days. The following calendar shows how to determine day 11.

Performing Your Test

WHEN TO START TESTING

- 1. Determine the length of your menstrual cycle before testing. The length of your menstrual cycle is the number of days from your first day of menstrual flow to the day before the next period begins.
- 2. Use the table below to determine when you should start testing. (If menstruation is irregular, take the shortest one in the last three months)
- 3. After calculating the start testing date, perform the test for consecutive 5 days, or until the LH surge has been detected. The content of this test kit (10 test strips) is sufficient for one month testing. If the test result is positive, it is recommended to perform multiple tests each day to find the best time for conception.

Interpreting Your Results



· If two color lines are visible, and the test line (T) is equal to or darker than the control line (C), you will probably ovulate in the next 24-48 hours. You are most probably to conceive if sexual intercourse coincides during this period.



NEGATIVE No LH Surge · **Only one** colored line appears in the control line (C), or the colored line appears in the test line (T) but is lighter than the control line (C). It indicates that the LH surge has not appeared yet and daily tests need to be continued.

INVALID T C

· No colored line appears in control line (C), even if there is a line appeared in the test line (T). Repeat with a new test strip.
