side up (as shown). Close needle on lace with needle nose pliers or top lightly with mallet so that prongs pierce lace and lock in place. To remove lace, spring open needle. Lacing puts the finishing touch to handmade leather articles. How good the finished project looks depends very much on the lacing. Thus, how you lace will have a great deal of importance in the appearance of the finished project. With the following instructions and illustrations, plus a little practice, you will soon be doing a neat, smooth job of lacing.

Note: Always lace with stamped or finished side of the project facing you.

## Threading a 2-Prong Lacing Needle

Note: You should load two yards of lacing in lacing needle at a time. Working with longer pieces of lacing will be difficult and can cause the lacing to wear and become frayed as it is pulled through the lacing holes.

## How to Lace & Splice the Double Loop Stitch

Recommendations: Use 3/32" or 1/8" lace with the same sized slits or holes. Double-Loop Lacing uses 7-8 times more lace than the length of the project (ex: 2' will need 14' to 16' of lace).
