Lesson 1	To explore the history of different kites and what they look like.	Children will explore different types of kites and why people make them. Children will learn about kites made in different countries and what they are used for. They will carry out tests to see which materials are more suitable for kite making. Lesson 3	To be able to make a simple Carp Kite.	Children will learn about the children's festival in Japan and what it means. They will learn what a carp kite is and why it is flown on Children's Day. Lesson 4	To explore designs of diamond kites.	Children will explore one of the easiest kites to make, a diamond kite. Children will look at images of different diamond kites and describe the colours and features they have. Lesson 5	To be able to construct a kite by following a design.	Children will use a range of materials to follow their plan and make a diamond kite.
