Lesson 1	To sketch, and improve upon sketches, in the style of the early drawings of Gustav Klimt.	Children will learn about Klimt's early life, then study his early portrait sketches. Lesson 2	To use symbolic imagery in the style of Gustav Klimt in works of art that share ideas, or tell a story.	Children will study Klimt's famous frieze, 'Beethoven Frieze' (1902), identifying and discussing aspects of its symbolism. Lesson 3	To review and revisit ideas, then use gilding in a Klimt- inspired work of art or product.	Children will study some famous Klimt pieces from his 'Golden Period' and consider how he was influenced by illuminated manuscripts. They may then either produce works of art based on sketches done previously, or create 'gilded' picture frames.	<ul> <li>Can children revisit and develop previous art work they have done?</li> <li>Can children use a growing range of techniques to develop and enhance their work?</li> <li>Can children consider and discuss the effect of the gold and silver gilding in Klimt's work?</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Slides</li> <li>Challenge Card 3A/3B/3C/3D</li> <li>Gold/silver-effect leaf and glue or metallic paint</li> </ul>
Lesson 4	To develop techniques used to create natural textures such as those in Klimt's landscape paintings.	Children will study Klimt's landscapes and identify ways in which he was influenced by other impressionist artists. They will then produce works of art in the style of, or using similar techniques to, Klimt.	<ul> <li>Can children identify aspects of Klimt's works which show how he was influenced by others?</li> <li>Can children identify and describe the colours and techniques used in Klimt's landscapes?</li> <li>Can children develop techniques to create textures in landscape drawings and paintings?</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Slides</li> <li>Landscape Photo Pack</li> <li>Binoculars and or telescopes (optional)</li> <li>Painting Distant Landscapes 4A</li> </ul>
Lesson 5	To develop techniques and use symbolism in the style of, or inspired by Gustav Klimt.	Children will look at paintings done by Klimt in his later life, identifying symbolism used to depict life and death. They will also consider ways in which death is depicted in other texts and works of art.
