<b>Lesson 1</b>	To explore the history of apartheid and its impact	In this first lesson, children will learn what apartheid was, and how it affected the lives of many people in South Africa. <b>Lesson 2</b>	To learn about Nelson Mandela and his life	Children will learn about Nelson Mandela, and how he dedicated his life to fighting for peace and equality in South Africa. They will make fact booklets, write biographies or role play interviews in their independent activities. <b>Lesson 3</b>	To understand Nelson Mandela's impact and what we can learn from him	In this final lesson, children find out more about Mandela's life after prison - how he became the first black president of South Africa, and the different charities he supported. In their independent activities, children will explore some of Mandela's famous quotes, discussing what they mean, and who they might inspire.
