	Can children identify some of the different ways in which women were perceived during this time?																			
Lesson 7	Can children order key events in the history of women's rights chronologically?																			
	Can children name some of the key people involved in women's rights movements and evaluate their contributions?																			
	Can children discuss and evaluate the issue of gender equality today?
