| Lesson 1 | To learn about the Royal Family. | This initial lesson introduces Queen Elizabeth II and her family to your class. | Lesson 2 | To explore the key events of Queen Elizabeth II's life. | In this lesson your children will learn all about Queen Elizabeth's life with facts about her childhood and life before she became queen. They will then think about some key events from her reign and create their own timeline of these events. Alternatively, challenge them to create their own biography of her life using the model text and supporting challenge cards. | Can children list some key events in Queen Elizabeth's life?
