Lesson 1	To be able to describe the location and features of the River Nile.	Children start by piecing together a jigsaw of the River Nile to find out what they will be learning about. Children will find out about the source and mouth of the Nile, as well as looking some of the geographical features along the length of the river, such as Lake Victoria, waterfalls, and the Nile Delta. Lesson 3	To find out the positive and negative effects of the Aswan High Dam on the River Nile.	Children will start by looking at the annual flooding of the Nile and go on to explore why this no longer happens since the construction of the Aswan High Dam. Lesson 4	To explore the physical and human geography of the Nile Delta.	Children will recap what a delta is and how deltas are formed before looking at some of the physical and human features of the Nile Delta. Children will consider whether the River Nile was more important in ancient times than today as the basis for exploring the many ways in which people use the Nile. Lesson 6	To be able to describe in detail a journey up the River Nile in Egypt.
