HOLY THURSDAY is the day of the institution of the Last Supper. Most of the attention at the Church is focused on the evening service with the Reading of the Twelve Passion Gospels. These contain the prayer of parting and the final address of Jesus to His apostles. It also contains the story of our Lord's arrest and trial, death and burial.



GOOD FRIDAY is a day of mourning. There is an aura of sadness, when little is eaten. Common joys are avoided. In Church, black coverings are on the altar. Sweet-smelling ointments are used. The winding-sheet, bearing the icon of the body replica of our Lord's tomb is set up. The service of Good Friday is a repetition of Christ's funeral. It is a burial service. Jesus has died. His body is taken from the cross and carried in procession around the church. It is finally placed in the tomb.

Lastly, SATURDAY is a day of anticipation and preparation. The faithful come to church to pray at the grave of our Lord, not unlike the visit they might make to a loved one who has died. They come to bid farewell, looking forward to the approaching brightness of Christ's Resurrection.

("Glory...both now..." and then "Through the intercessions...")

* At the Second Antiphon:

1. I believed, and therefore have I spoken: but I was deeply humiliated. What shall I render unto the Lord, for all His benefits unto me?

("Save us, O Son of God..." after each verse.)

- 2. I will take the cup of Salvation, and call upon the Name of the Lord.
- 3. I will pay my vows unto the Lord in the presence of all His people. ("Glory...both now..." and then "O, only begotten Son and Word of God...")

At the Entrance:

The Troparion of Lazarus in tone 1 is chanted "O Christ God, when Thou didst raise Lazarus..."

❖ The Eisodikon (Entrance Hymn) of Palm Sunday:

Blessed is He that cometh in the name of the Lord. God is the Lord and hath appeared unto us. Save us O Son of God, Who didst sit upon the foal of an ass; who sing to Thee. Alleluia.

After the Little Entrance, the following are chanted:

The Troparion of Lazarus in tone 1:

O Christ God, when Thou didst raise Lazarus from the dead before Thy passion, Thou didst confirm the universal resurrection; wherefore we like babes carry the banner of triumph and victory, and cry unto Thee, O Vanquisher of death, Hosanna in the highest. Blessed is He that cometh in the name of the Lord.

The Troparion of Palm Sunday in tone 4:

O Christ God, when we were buried with Thee in Baptism, we became deserving of Thy resurrection to immortal life. Wherefore, we praise Thee, crying, Hosanna in the highest, blessed is He that cometh in the name of the Lord.

The Kontakion of Palm Sunday in tone 6:

Upborne upon the heavenly throne, and seated upon the earthly foal, O Christ our God, receive the praises of angels and the hymns of men, exclaiming before Thee, Blessed is He that cometh to restore Adam.

The Epistle

Blessed is He that cometh in the name of the Lord.

O give thanks unto the Lord, for He is good, for His mercy endureth forever. *The reading is from the Holy Apostle Paul to the Philippians (4:4-9).*

Brethren, rejoice in the Lord always; again I will say, Rejoice. Let all men know your forbearance. The Lord is at hand. Have no anxiety about anything, but in everything by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be made known to God. And the peace of God, which passes all understanding, will keep your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus. Finally, brethren, whatever is true, whatever is honorable, whatever is just, whatever is pure, whatever is lovely, whatever is gracious, if there is any excellence, if there is anything worthy of praise, think about these things. The Gospel

The reading from the Holy Gospel according to St. John (12:1-18).

Six days before the Passover, Jesus came to Bethany, where Lazarus who had died was, whom Jesus had raised from the dead. There they made Him a supper; Martha served, and Lazarus was one of those at table with Him. Mary took a pound of costly ointment of pure nard and anointed the feet of Jesus and wiped His feet with her hair; and the house was filled with the fragrance of the ointment. But Judas Iscariot, Simon's son, one of His Disciples (he who as to betray Jesus), said, "Why was this ointment not sold for three hundred denarii and given to the poor?" This he said, not because he cared for the poor but because he was a thief, and as he had the moneybox he used to take what was put into it. Jesus said, "Let her alone, let her keep it for the day of My burial. The poor you always have with you, but you do not always have Me." When the great crowd of the Jews learned that He was there, they came, not only on account of Jesus but also to see Lazarus, whom Jesus had raised from the dead. So the chief priests planned to put Lazarus also to death, because on account of him many of the Jews were going away and believing in Jesus. The next day a great crowd who had come to the feast heard that Jesus was coming to Jerusalem. So they took branches of palm trees and went out to meet him, crying, "Hosanna! Blessed is He Who cometh in the Name of the Lord, the King of Israel!" And Jesus found a young donkey and sat upon it; as it is written, "Fear not, daughter of Zion; behold, your king is coming, sitting on a donkey's colt!" His Disciples did not understand this at first; but when Jesus was glorified, then they remembered that this had been written of Him and had been done to Him. The crowd that had been with Jesus when He called Lazarus out of the tomb and raised him from the dead bore witness. The reason why the crowd went to meet Jesus was that they heard He had done this sign.
