THE STORY OF ST. THOMAS

ach year on the Sunday following the Resurrection, our Church remembers the incident involving St. Thomas, with its remarkable turning of doubt into faith. When Christ was crucified, the apostles fled in fear. For all of them, life had lost its meaning; their hopes and dreams were shattered as the Lord was laid in the tomb. But they came together Sunday evening after the crucifixion, seeking comfort in their sadness.

It was then that the Risen Christ suddenly appeared in their midst. They looked at Him and couldn't believe their eyes. But Jesus spoke to them, showed them His wounds, and convinced them of the reality of His presence. They rejoiced with renewed hope.

But Thomas was not present that evening. Later, when the Apostles told him the good news of the Resurrection, he replied: "Unless I see in His hands the print of the nails . . . and place my hand in His side, I will not believe."

A week passed by. On the Sunday after the Resurrection, once again the apostles were gathered together. This time Thomas was there. In spite of the locked doors, the Risen Christ again suddenly appeared amongst them and greeted them with words of peace. He called Thomas to His side and had him place his fingers in the wounds and see for himself, saying: "Do not be faithless, but believing."

Thomas did as the Lord had asked. Then he fell to his knees and cried out: "My Lord and my God!" His doubts were gone, replaced by a deep and abiding faith. Jesus then responded, "Because you have seen Me, you have believed. Blessed are they who have not seen, and yet have believed."



The Gospel

The reading is from the Holy Gospel according to St. John (20:19-31).

On the evening of that day, the first day of the week, the doors being shut where the Disciples were, for fear of the Jews, Jesus came and stood among them and said to them, 'Peace be with you.' When He had said this, He showed them His hands and His side. Then the Disciples were glad when they saw the Lord. Jesus said to them again, 'Peace be with you. As the Father has sent Me, even so I send you.' And when He had said this, He breathed on them, and said to them, 'Receive the Holy Spirit. If you forgive the sins of any, they are forgiven; if you retain the sins of any, they are retained." Now Thomas, one of the Twelve, called the Twin, was not with them when Jesus came. So the other disciples told him, 'We have seen the Lord.' But he said to them, 'Unless I see in His hands the print of the nails, and place my finger in the mark of the nails, and place my hand in His side, I will not believe.' Eight days later, His Disciples were again in the house, and Thomas was with them. The doors were shut, but Jesus came and stood among them, and said, 'Peace be with you.' Then He said to Thomas. 'Put your finger here and see My hands; and put out your hand, and place it in My side, do not be faithless, but believing.' Thomas answered Him, 'My Lord and my God!' Jesus said to him, 'Have you believed because you have seen Me? Blessed are those who have not seen and yet believe.' Now Jesus did many other signs in the presence of the disciples, which are not written in this book; but these are written that you may believe that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God, and that believing you may have life in His name.

VII. At "Commemorating our most blessed Lady. . . " the following Megalynarion:

"O most radiant lamp, the Theotokos, the immeasurable honor, which is more exalted than all creatures, with praises do we magnify thee."

VIII. Instead of "We have seen the true light," sing "Christ is risen" once.

The Troparion of PASCHA

English

Christ is risen from the dead, trampling down death by death, and upon those in the tombs bestowing life!

Arabic

Al masihu qama min bain il amwat, wa watia al mawta bil mawt, wa wahaba al hayat, lil lathina fil qubur!

Greek

Christos anesti ek nekron, thanato thanaton patesas kai tis en tis mnemasi zoe charisamenos!

- I. After "Blessed is the kingdom" "Christ is risen" is sung three times.
- II. At the First Antiphon:
 - 1. "Shout with joy to God, all the earth; sing to His name, give glory to His praises." ("Through the intercessions . . ." *after each verse*).
 - 2. "Say to God: 'How awesome are Thy works; let all the earth worship Thee, and sing to Thee. Let it sing a song to Thy Name, O most High."

"Glory . . . both now. . ." and then "Through the intercessions . . ."

III. At the Second Antiphon:

- 1. "May God have mercy upon us, and bless us, and may He cause His face to shine upon us, and have mercy upon us."
 - ("Save us, O Son of God, Who art risen from the dead; who sing to Thee. Alleluia." after each verse).
- 2. "That Thy way be known upon earth, Thy salvation among all nations; let the peoples give thanks to Thee, O God, let all the peoples give thanks to Thee."
- 3. "May God bless us, and may all the ends of the earth fear Him."

 "Glory . . . both now. . ." and then "O only begotten Son and Word. . ."

IV. At the third Antiphon:

1. "Let God arise, and let His enemies be scattered, and let those who hate Him flee from before His face."

(*Then,* "Christ is risen. . ." after each verse).

- 2. "As smoke vanisheth, so let them vanish; as wax melteth before the fire."
- 3. "So let sinners perish at the presence of God; and let the righteous be glad."
- 4. "This is the day the Lord hath made; let us rejoice and be glad therein."

V. At the Little Entrance:

"In the gathering places bless God the Lord, from the springs of Israel. Save us, O Son of God, Who art risen from the dead, who sing to Thee: Alleluia."

- VI. After the Little Entrance, the following are chanted:
- -The troparion of Thomas in tone 7:

"While the tomb was sealed, Thou didst shine forth from it, O Life. While the doors were closed, Thou didst come in to Thy Disciples, O Christ God, Resurrection of all, renewing in us through them an upright spirit, according to the greatness of Thy mercy."

- The kontakion of Pascha in tone 8:

"O Immortal One, when Thou didst descend into the tomb, Thou didst destroy the power of Hades; and Thou didst rise victorious, O Christ God. Thou hast said to the ointment-bearing women: Rejoice! And Thou gavest peace to Thy Disciples, O Bestower of Resurrection to those who had fallen."

The Epistle

Great is the Lord, and great is His power. Praise the Lord, for the Lord is good. The reading is from the Acts of the Saintly and Pure Apostles (5:12-20).

"In those days, many signs and wonders were done among the people by the hands of the Apostles. And they were all together in Solomon's Portico. None of the rest dared join them, but the people held them in high honor. And more than ever believers were added to the Lord, multitudes both of men and women, so that they even carried out the sick into the streets, and laid them on beds and pallets, that as Peter came by at least his shadow might fall on some of them. The people also gathered from the towns around Jerusalem, bringing the sick and those afflicted with unclean spirits, and they were all healed. But the high priest rose up and all who were with him, that is, the party of the Sadducees, and filled with jealousy they arrested the Apostles and put them in the common prison. But at night an angel of the Lord opened the prison doors and brought them out and said, 'Go and stand in the temple and speak to the people all the words of this Life.'"
