A NOTE ON ACCESSIBILITY


We want Galway Theatre Festival to be accessible to all. Should you face barriers to accessibility or require additional support, please inform the GTF Team and we will do all we can to help.

COUNTLESS CATHLEENS



Part urgent gathering, part explosive event, Party Scene asks: when does an underground scene become a community crisis, and when is it time for the party to end?



Ní Liomsa an Teach Álainn Seo (This is Not My Beautiful House), is an experimental theatre piece fusing monologue theatre with music and digital art, presented in the Irish language. The show is an invocation of the storytelling tradition, accompanied by the music of the harp, laying out four separate vignettes of people's experience of leaving and being left.

Performed by native Irish speaker Seoirsín Bashford (The Crow's Way) and written by Anna Ní Dhúill (Exit Music For Our World), Ní Liomsa an Teach Álainn Seo is a invitation to non-Irish and Gaelic speakers alike to experience the language through stories of shared understanding.

You will need headphones, a device with internet connection and access to your bedroom, to a public toilet and to a river. Preferably THE river Corrib, but others will do, too.

So much so that Kitty feels compelled to make one final effort to uncover the truth of her vanished man's whereabouts.



Comedian and writer Martin Warde's debut play is a powerful and moving dark comedy that explores complex themes of family, tradition, and self- acceptance.


Set in the house of the deceased, the play is a testament to the resilience of the human spirit and the importance of finding one's voice and identity.



ARTIST DEVELOPMENT

One of Galway Theatre Festival's key aims is to create sustainable development pathways for theatre artists working in the West of Ireland. In addition to our annual nine-day festival, we run two artist development programmes; Dramaturgy Development Programme (run in partnership with Fishamble: The New Play Company) & Síológ: Irish Language Work Development Programme (run in partnership with An Taibhdhearc).

Each year, Galway Theatre Festival selects a number of artists to partake in each programme. Artists partaking in our Dramaturgy programme are paired with a professional dramaturg, who works with the artist to support & guide them in the development of early-stage work. Artists partaking in Síológ are provided with rehearsal support during the development of an Irish language work.

Through our development programmes we aim to create sustainable opportunities for artists to; develop their practice, forge partnerships & experience the work of others in the West. Our programmes ensure the well-researched, steady development of work, by providing artists in the West with the resources necessary to meet national & international standards.

Eimear Finan is a Galway based artist who trained as an actor at The American Academy of Dramatic Arts, New York and in more recent years has started a career as a playwright. In 2022 she debuted Tart at the Galway Theatre Festival to rave reviews and full houses. Lived experience fuels her work which explores feminist issues. She strives to create art that can open, excite and even change minds. Most recently, with the support of The Galway Theatre Festival and guidance of dramaturg George Jibson and director Amy Reade, her newest play, Wife (working title) has been brought to draft stage and is workshop ready. Wife (working title) is a devastatingly dark comedy that looks at the current war on women and the ravaging effect the patriarchy has on all genders.



Brídín Nic Dhonncha is a theatre maker from Connemara.

Her piece An Ceilpeadóir is currently in development and it explores memory, grief, ableism and biodiversity collapse. The work includes performance, music and visual art.



Chloe Naomi is the writer & director of an original dance theatre project that follows the story of two lovers, Loveen and Maggot, who are navigating their relationship whilst being trapped inside their damp and moldy apartment.

This fragmented dark comedy is rooted in relationship psychology research and speaks to the multigenerational loneliness that is experienced within the Irish zeitgeist.

Pupa is being presented by Ciaróg Productions and was written/directed by Chloe Naomi, choreographed by Ari Bhatti and composed by Barra MacMahon.
