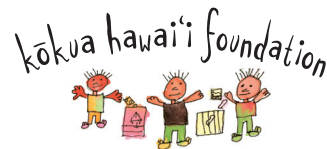

ABOUT THE CENTERPIECE ART

Our theme of Preserving Sacred Places is represented by the photograph of a location on Oahu that serves as your table marker. As Surfrider continues its mission to preserve our coastlines, in the coming year we will also be highlighting the efforts of other organizations & communities around our island that share in our mission. Creating a cohesive community of conservation will strengthen our efforts to preserve these scared places for generations to come. All photographs were taken by Rafael Bergstrom (Raftography.com).

Each of your tables also has a vase filled with small plastic debris known as "microplastics" (< 5 mm) and "mesoplastics" (5 mm to 2.5 cm), that have been hand sifted from Oahu's Kahuku and Waimanlo Bay shorelines by dedicated volunteers. These vases are akin to what samples from our world's oceans often look like, filled with a floating confetti of man-made plastic that are of special concern because they are both difficult to remove and pose a high risk of being ingested by marine life and entering our food chain. All the decor was created with the principle of re-use in mind, minimizing the purchase of new materials. #RiseAbovePlastics #BanTheFoam

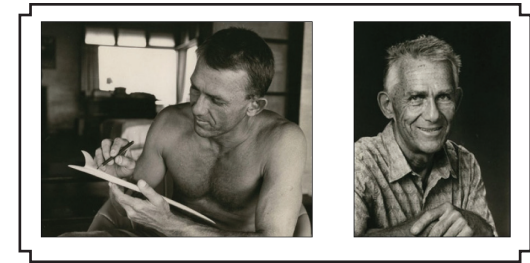

ABOUT THE 12TH ANNUAL JOHN KELLY ENVIRONMENTAL ACHIEVEMENT AWARDS

Surfrider O'ahu John Kelly Environmental Achievement Awards recognize those who have made the greatest contributions towards protecting or enhancing our coastal community and environment. John Kelly, for whom the award is named, was the original recipient of the Lifetime Achievement category.

For decades, John Kelly led many environmental crusades on O'ahu including founding "Save Our Surf" which helped to save 140 surf sites on O'ahu and around the state; while also stopping many destructive developments. Sadly, John Kelly passed away in 2007, but through his annual event he will be remembered and honored by the Surfrider Foundation. Following his wake, Surfrider's O'ahu Chapter has worked with other organizations to help preserve Pupukea-Paumalu (aka, Save Sunset Beach), Kaka'ako Park and Waimea Valley.

The John Kelly Perpetual Trophy is a small koa surfboard, beautifully shaped as a board from the early days of Waikiki, when the water and the sand were clean, there were no grains of jetties, and there was plenty of beach access.
